According to these guidelines, there are 7 Marks of Congregational Vitality which include the following:

- **Lifelong Discipleship Formation**
 - ❖ (as opposed to complacency, apathy)
- **Intentional Authentic Evangelism**
 - ❖ (not just one committee's responsibility)
- **Outward Incarnational Focus**
 - ❖ (not simply inward institutional survival)
- **Empowered Servant Leadership**
 - ❖ (no monopoly on leadership)
- **Spirit-Inspired Worship**
 - ❖ (not consumer or entertainment driven)
- **Caring Relationships**
 - ❖ (not a social club, or clique-ish)
- **Ecclesial Health**
 - ❖ (a healthy church environment/relationships/dynamics)

I challenge each of you to take some time this summer to reflect and pray about these areas and think through which you believe to be most important to our congregation at this time in its history. How can you contribute to our congregational vitality?

Please also feel free to reach out to one of the Elders or Deacons and share your thoughts. Better yet, get together for a cup of coffee and have some good conversation about this important topic.

God is surely at work in our midst and exciting things are happening at FPC Mesa! We want to continue to stretch and grow into new areas of mission and ministry. How do you see God at work? What vision or dream do you have for our congregation? How will you offer your gifts in service to God and God's people?



Comments from Chris

God is Good All The Time!

Life is full of changes and new adventures. Throughout our adventures we strive to keep to the truth that even though life has ups and downs we know how God is constant and always good. A few short weeks ago my family embarked upon the adventure of moving, which was several years in the making.

Prior to 2011, Heather and I called Southern California home. I had been a Christian Education Director at Garden Grove United Methodist Church, and Heather was new in her career as a teacher in special education. During the 2011 recession Heather's small district cut her job so we found ourselves scrambling to find her a teaching position. We discovered there were very few available jobs in Southern California, so Heather started applying for positions in the northern part of the state, which were plentiful at the time. Heather soon accepted a job, and we started making preparations to move to San Jose. I learned full-time Christian Educator positions were very rare, so I accepted a part-time position with Sunnyvale United Methodist, in addition to various other jobs. Somehow we were able to make ends meet. God is good all the time!

We had a rude awakening to the extreme high cost of living in Northern California, which continued to weigh heavy on us during our time in San Jose. In 2013, we welcomed Matthew to our world. We were so happy and blessed to be parents, especially after a very challenging pregnancy. I soon accepted a Christian Educator position at Westminster Presbyterian in San Jose. Even though it was part-time, the pay was better and I was able to make arrangements to be a full-time stay at home dad. God is good all the time!

During Matthew's early toddler years we discovered his language delay and autism. My part-time position soon became a blessing since I had the availability to get Matthew the valuable therapy he required. God is good all the time!

Even though we were able to make financial ends meet, we knew the housing cost would very soon get to the point of no return. We realized there was no hope of purchasing a home in San Jose. Every year Heather and I had a serious discussion if we were going to stay one more year. We also missed the emotional support of being around extended family. My Dad had been living in Phoenix for several years, and Heather's folks recently moved near Mesa. Heather and I knew we needed to make a change soon so we could be in a healthier position. My seminary mentor, Rev. Bob Rohdenburg, often preached how God is good all the time and to let go and let God.

Last December, I learned about the open ministry position at First Presbyterian Church Mesa, so after prayerful consideration I decided to apply and interview. The prayer was answered in multi-faceted ways. It was time to take the leap of faith and make the big change. We know the truth with how God's presence is constant and God's goodness endures forever. I look forward to being in ministry with you. It is good to be home at First Presbyterian Church Mesa!
