Here is how the silent auction bidding works:

Each item has a number and a sheet on which to write bids. The items will be in Fellowship Hall after church every Sunday in November.

1. If you want an item, write your name on that sheet of paper and the amount you want to bid.



2. You may write your name under someone if your bid is higher.

3. If you are bidding online, you must text or call in your bid to 480-380-2980. You will receive a text back to let you know your bid was written down.

4. You may call or text 480-380-2980 at any time to check on an item and what the highest bid is at that time, so you can decide if you want to bid higher.
