



# A Message from Christian

December 2025

Dear Church Family,

December is here, and our worship space has quietly become a different place. The greens are up—every wreath, garland, and swag lovingly hung by the decorating crew last week. The big Advent wreath now stands in its place of honor, its three purple oil candles, a single rose one, and waiting to be lit is the Christ candle. And thanks to the up-lights, the whole sanctuary is bathed in the rich purple of royalty and repentance. Even though the greens are artificial and the candles burn oil instead of wax, the message is unmistakable: something royal is on the way.

All through November we traced God's great rescue story:

- a perfect creation that declared God's goodness,
- a devastating fall that brought bondage,
- a promise to Abraham that would reach every family on earth,
- a breathtaking deliverance through the Red Sea that proved nothing can stop God from saving His people.

That entire story was moving toward one moment—the moment the Promise becomes a Person. This month we live in **Awaiting the Arrival: Advent's Call to Faith**. One by one, week by week, the oil candles will glow to life under the purple light:

- December 7 Preparation: Clearing the Way
- December 14 Transformation: Renewed by Promise MUSIC SUNDAY!
- December 21 Incarnation: God Draws Near
- December 24 Christmas Eve: The Presence Revealed (2:00 and 6:00 p.m.)

Circle December 14 in red—our Music Sunday. Guest musicians will join the choir for an extended morning of song that will make the rafters ring. We'll rejoice with Isaiah's blooming desert and lift Mary's Magnificat as the good news of God's great reversal fills this purple-lit room. This is the ideal Sunday to bring

someone who loves Christmas music but may not yet know the Savior the music is about. Invitation cards are on the welcome desk and in the pews—grab a handful and pray over the names God puts on your heart.

Then, on Christmas Eve, we'll light every candle, dim the lights just enough for the oil flames to dance, and hear the angels sing that the long-promised Child has finally come.

So come this Sunday. Step into the purple light. Breathe in the evergreen. Prepare your heart. The King is drawing near, and He is worth every song we have.


Thank you for the ongoing support of the Food Pantry and Clothing Closet. We are serving more clients than ever and appreciate your contributions.

## First Presbyterian Church of Mesa announces its Capital fundraising campaign.

#### Who we are:

FPC Mesa has a 75-year history of supporting the community with education and economic mobility. We are a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with several ministries working to fulfill our role as a pillar of refuge for the downtown Mesa community.

Our church's mission is to help people in the local and global community. All contributions designated for assistance go toward giving, and not to administration or overhead. Our faithful congregation takes care of that part however; we need your help with some capital needs (more on that later).

#### What we do:

FPC volunteers interact daily with the community providing direct assistance to people in need. We actively give our time, talent, and treasure to promote education and social mobility. Some of these programs have reached their sunset while others have just started. Our commitment to these areas remains.

## Education for children of all ages

- Head Start. Every child deserves a strong start, and every family deserves the support they need to thrive. We believe in the potential of every child and the power of early childhood education to shape a brighter future for all.
- Urban Promise Honduras. Sustains Christian-based youth development organizations and to seed their new ministries as they serve vulnerable children and teens in our world's most under-resourced communities

## **Economic Mobility**

- Mesa Presbyterian Ministries. Providing direct financial grants to working parents who need help paying for rent, food, and utilities.
- FPC Mesa Deacon's Food Bank. Weekly food distribution to families to ease the worry of food insecurity
- FPC Mesa Deacon's Clothing Closet. A free store where needy families can select from a wide range of season-appropriate clothing.
- MADD works with the courts to offer information seminars to convicted drivers which lower the incidence of drunk driving.

#### How You Can Help

FPC is blessed with contributions from our members that are sufficient to cover daily needs. This year our capital funding goal is to raise \$100,000 for repairs and improvements to our facilities to ensure the long-term success of our mission. Here are some areas needing improvement or repair.

- Air conditioning units for our music and childcare building: \$15,000
- New roof for our music and childcare building: \$35,000
- Remodel men's and women's restrooms, adding handicap accessibility: \$25,000
- Repairs to our commercial kitchen: \$5,000
- Sail shades for patio area to make outside gatherings more comfortable: \$5,000
- Concrete repairs to sidewalks and building foundation: \$15,000

You can help with these items by donating money, time, or skills. Or, you can donate items for our annual silent auction. Or, you can sponsor our next neighborhood festival.
