 We once again hosted the January Series conducted by Calvin University.







- Presbyterian Heritage Sunday also Memorial Day Sunday kicked off Summer Worship in Fellowship Hall. The service that day included offerings from The Handbell Quintet, Dei Gloriam Handbell Choir and One Voice. Summer worship continued through Labor Day as we enjoyed varied modes of seating including sofas, beanbags, high-tops and traditional tables and chairs. The Fellowship Commission's refreshment teams made sure we had beverages and snacks before, during and after worship.

Mission



Seasonal Ministries – Angel Tree: We sponsored three families this year, two from the Preschool and one from the Food Pantry. Additionally, we also gave each family a frozen turkey, food boxes, cleaning items, paper items and gift cards. Everything was delivered on Sunday, December, 22, 2024. A big thanks to everyone who participated.

Silent Auction – We held a silent auction in November, which raised over \$1400 for mission projects in our community.

Café Justo – We are continuing our partnership with Frontera de Cristo. We try to order coffee each quarter. By buying coffee from them, we are helping the farmers to earn a living wage.

Community Outreach – We had two community events to bring families and neighbors together. Thank you to everyone who has helped to make these events a success! In March, we had a Spring Festival with

games, food, musical groups, and a petting zoo. There were about 200 in attendance.

In October, we had a Fall Festival with games, food, Arizona Rick, the balloon cowboy, a photo booth and trunk or treat. We had about 400 in attendance.



Blessing Bags – We created 100 blessing bags in May, filled with necessities like deodorant, Chapstick, shampoo, toothpaste/toothbrush, comb, granola bars and then handed them out to those in need at the food pantry, community dinners and cooling centers around Mesa.

Community Dinners - We continued our monthly community dinners throughout 2024 on the first Wednesday of the month with an activity to let families enjoy a meal and fellowship with others from the community. We served an average of 50 people each dinner.

I-Help - For the year 2024, FPC hosted approximately ten women each Sunday of the month. This included dinner, showers, a safe place to sleep and a sack lunch for the next day. Because of funding, the program ended in Mesa at the end of October. I want to thank our FPC host volunteers; this program could not have continued for so many years without your years of dedication!



Mesa Presbyterian Ministries (MPM) – Mesa Presbyterian Ministries, started by Bob Gerlach, is a qualified charitable organization with the mission to keep families in their homes. Congregational members Jack and Yvonne Oliver, and Brent Gregory volunteer to call and interview clients who need help paying their rent and utilities. Over one hundred families received a total of \$43,207 in assistance from MPM in 2024.

Special Offerings – Thank you for your continued generosity! One Great Hour of Sharing was \$1,950, Pentecost Offering was \$1,405, Peace and Global Witness Offering was \$641.30, and Christmas Joy Offering was \$335.40.

Our Values

Worship

We value worship, hearing the Word, enjoying and praising God through music, celebrating what we believe, sharing our walk with Jesus and striving to be a place where all people can belong.

Fellowship

Members of all ages love being together with each other and with our neighbors. Whether worshiping together, praising and celebrating through music, breaking bread, or working together in mission, we strive to be welcoming to all, valuing everyone.

Outreach/Evangelism

We celebrate what we believe by putting our faith into action through activities that care for our neighbors (near and far) while manifesting the gospel. Through these activities we invite them to come into a closer relationship with Christ, ourselves and each other. Current activity examples are the Food Pantry/Clothing Closet, I Help, MPM, community dinners and neighborhood festivals.

Discipleship

We nurture and grow our relationship with Christ in many ways. Those include Bible Study, Bible-centered worship, teaching our youth, sharing with others our faith walk with Jesus, and caring for each other and our neighbors.

Discipleship

Probably the biggest change of 2024 took place with the consolidation of the Elder positions, shortly before the arrival of our new Pastor Christian Johnson. The elderships of Adult Education, Youth & Young Adults, and Children & Family Ministries were consolidated into Discipleship, headed up by Kyle Harding (yours truly). We decided that this responsibility needs to eventually go back out to more than one person and have the full intention of splitting the role between at least two people to replace me at the end of my tenure as elder in Summer. It will most likely be split between a Children's Ministries Elder and a Youth & Young Adult Ministries Elder with a combined effort keeping an eye on the Adult Education groups, which tend to run themselves.

Adult Bible Study has continued as usual after church every Sunday, led by Rev. Soderquist, focusing on the book of Proverbs. Men's Fellowship has also been meeting on Tuesdays at noon in Fellowship Hall or on Zoom.

On May 15th, the Preschool held its end of the school year Spring Fling, in which the children sang to their parents' delight and time was spent recognizing the teachers for their hard work. After the successful year came to a close, Shiloh tendered her resignation after 12 years of dedicated and amazing service to the Preschool as its director. The church recognized Shiloh for her work and has since hired Pearl Blair as director.

Montlure Traveling Day Camp was held this past summer at Mission Del Sol between June 10th and June 14th. FPC Mesa is planning on hosting Traveling Day Camp in the summer of 2025 in partnership with Angel Tree to provide a fulfilling and joyous camp experience for the children of our Angel Tree families.

Since the beginning of this year, Anita Ramsey has taken primary responsibility of running "Time With Our Children" during worship with focuses on a simplified version of the lessons/ sermons preached after, with lots of good engagement with the children. We have also continued with the curriculum of Growing in Grace & Gratitude for Sunday School, as we had the year before, since it's befitting the age group of the children that attend. We also continued last year's Sunday School teaching rotations until Summer, and added Kate McMichael and Fernando McCune to the rotation beginning in Fall 2024.

Kate McMichael has been heading up a creative endeavor called "Spirit of Play," which aims to integrate Ellen Gillespie's puppets with Sunday School, improving child engagement and interest, as well as discussing the idea of practicing some of these lessons as miniature "shows" to perform for their own parents. As of the beginning of 2025, the puppets now have a home in the Resource Room, and we encourage the other Sunday School teachers to make full use of them if they so desire.

The Young Adult Group was very active this year having events almost every month including a Mario Kart tournament during the summer, serving specialty coffee together, as well as attending a volunteer event at Feed My Starving Children in July. We also participated in a full moon tour at the Southwest Wildlife Conservation Center where our very own Darlene Sitzler volunteers. We capped off the year with a fun-filled Christmas Party with Christmas Trivia, a White Elephant Gift Exchange, and a saran-wrap ball roll full of prizes.





FPC Mesa Presbyterian Women had a productive year focused on serving and giving. The heart of our program lies in our Circles, which include attention to mission work and Bible study and maybe some social interaction and loving support, too. From January to May, we concluded the Horizon study Sacred Encounters, The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Acts by Olive Mahabir. From September to December and into the new year, most monthly groups are using Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation by Patricia Tull.

One major accomplishment of the year was the formation of a new evening circle, Salome, which joins Eve, Deborah and Rachel. It presents the opportunity for women who are not available during the day to still participate in fellowship and support. All women are invited and encouraged to attend any of the circles any time. Dates and times of Circle meetings are listed in the Update and La Palabra.

Some of the highlights of PW 2024 include the following:

- We made and distributed Epiphany Star Words for people of the church and beyond;
- Women's Gifts Sunday welcomed the Rev. Joca Gallegos from First Presbyterian Church, Douglas, Arizona, and Frontera de Cristo borderland ministries to deliver the message. A PW highlight of every year is the awarding of the Honorary Lifetime Membership, and this year this prestigious recognition was presented to Jack Oliver for his years of innumerable physical, artistic, and spiritual contributions to our church.



 In April, six ladies attended the PW of the Presbytery of the Grand Canyon Spring Gathering at Orangewood Presbyterian Church and enjoyed being with PWs from several other churches.



• Mesa PW hosted our own luncheon in May and invited ladies from the area. Our guest speaker was Chris Casanova, our PW Synod representative and now Synod Moderator, who shared information about the national USA Mission Experience, which our presbytery hosted for guests from around the country. Not only did they learn

about the beauty and wonders of the Southwest; the trip extended to the border at Douglas/Agua Prieta where they learned about our bor-

der ministry, Frontera de Cristo.

 During our summer break, Susan Durand and Carol Anderson attended the Churchwide Gathering in St. Louis in July. It was amazing to share the inspirational event with PWs from around the country and world.



- In September, we debuted a new mobile book cart in Fellowship Hall, which features a suggested reading list compiled by PWP. Our thanks to Susan McMichael for originating and completing that project which provides books for the whole congregation!
- In November, a group of us volunteered at Feed My Starving Children in Tempe. Additional opportunities have continued. It is a fun and worthwhile activity that provides foods for the hungry around the world.



• Our Christmas Holiday Luncheon was a more intimate FPC event on a Tuesday, featuring a potluck and video of one speaker from the Churchwide Gathering. We all agreed it was pleasant, relaxed, and stress-free, and we will probably continue this practice.

We are proudest of our tradition of giving to support our chosen missions, as well as PW philanthropies. Let us share our giving priorities:

Our deepest gratitude goes to Sara McWhorter, who in the name of FPC PW, makes prayer quilt squares that are offered to guests, friends, and anyone who would like one. She has made hundreds over the course of a couple years; recipients are always pleased and appreciative as they are reminded of the ever-present love of Jesus.

Sara and Suzi Payton sewed beautiful quilts which they donated to the FPC Mission Silent Auction last November. PW also donated gift cards for Honey Baked Hams for the fundraiser.

The missions we support annually through our PW budget include FPC Preschool, Mesa Presbyterian Ministries, FPC Food Pantry, FPC Clothes Closet, Montlure Camp, Salvation Army, as well as New Leaf Autumn House, and the Child Crisis Center. These missions are supported solely by members' pledges and special gifts. In 2024, PW also donated monies not used for Churchwide scholarships to the church to help support FPC's underfunded Per Capita fund.

PCUSA PW promotes two special offerings each year: Birthday (spring) and Thank (fall) Offerings. Also, at each event, Circle meetings and more, donations are collected for our "Least Coin" philanthropy. These offerings support projects both domestically and internationally and demonstrate that a small offering by many people adds up amazingly!

Glory to God for all the blessings we share as a PW, part of FPC Mesa, part of PW in Presbytery of the Grand Canyon, and part of PW in Synod of the Southwest!

STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE

The members of the Finance Committee are Stewardship Elder Brent Gregory, Property Elder Dave Frederick, Clerk of Session Carol Gerlach, Endowment Committee chair Jack Gunter, and atlarge members Carolyn Barber, Peter Eisenklam, Bob Gerlach, Jan Montgomery and Jeff Seehorn. Pastor Christian Johnson and bookkeeper Rob Kjar also attended meetings. The committee met monthly to review the church's financial reports and has undertaken the following actions in 2024:

- Recommended the 2024 budget to the Session.
- Completed a financial review for the year ending 12/31/2023.
- Completed a successful stewardship campaign with pledges totaling \$277,052 for the general fund and \$21,470 for the capital fund.
- Prepared a 2025 budget draft with the assistance of commissions and committees.

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE

The members of the Endowment Committee are Dave Frederick, Jack Gunter, Renita Jurgensen, Ron Payton, and Todd Ramsey, with Brent Gregory, Stewardship and Finance Elder serving as an ex-officio member. The committee met three times during 2024 and has undertaken the following actions:

- Continued oversight of the Endowment Funds investment with a 2024 beginning balance of \$414,285 and a year-end balance of \$447,144.
- Loaned \$10,000 to the church's general account from the General Endowment.
- Disbursed \$2,880 for organ maintenance.
- Disbursed \$3,315 for the sanctuary sound system.
- Disbursed \$1,055 for Montlure camperships.
- Continued to interpret the endowment concept to the congregation through the Endowment Funds brochure.

Deacons

As always, the work of the Deacons is that of compassion and connection. Deacons have been contacting people on their care list through phone calls, text messages, letters, cards and visits throughout the year. In March, in coordination with Fellowship, Deacons gave personal invitations to their flock to join them at the monthly potluck. People really responded with a great turn out.

Beyond the basic ministry to reach out to members within the church, the Deacons Food Pantry and Clothing Closet ministries continue to reach out to serve the community. Cheryl Gregory coordinates the Clothing Closet, while Betty Jean Reid-Hoeffer manages the Food Pantry. Reports from each are below. Flyers about current events are available and handed out. The Christmas Angel Tree ministry gave gifts to three families again this year, two from Food Panty and one from Preschool.

In addition, the Deacons are involved in the Welcoming Ministry as part of the visioning initiative to be a Welcoming Church. We started putting the information kiosk in front of the sanctuary staffed by volunteers from the congregation at large. There is a rotating roster with volunteers who have signed up. We are making sure information is current and inviting, and that we have a warm welcome for all who come, visitors and church members alike.

Clothes Closet

Our mission continues to grow! We are serving our neighbors in the apartments, people who see the signs when they are driving by and advertising online. On average, in 2024 we served 30-35 people every Friday.

- We are advertising on Facebook and Instagram.
- We are open from 8:00-9:00 a.m.
- Clothing donations are collected every Sunday.
- Donations should be gently used, clean and free from damage.

The closet is mostly filled by donations of church members and their friends. We are so thankful for having such a loving and caring congregation!

We welcome anyone who would like to join us any Friday morning from 8:00-9:00 a.m. This is a helpful and rewarding ministry that our church is providing to our community.

Deacon Food Pantry

The Deacon's Food Pantry is on the frontline in the fight against food insecurity weekly, getting food into the hands of those who need it with the help of donations from the congregation and Midwest Food



Bank. In 2024, 1,202 people/families were given approximately 20 pounds of groceries. The food pantry saw the highest volumes in both summer and holiday months.
