The FPC Artist Series will host the Valley Chamber Chorale for a concert on Saturday, February 1st, at 2:00 p.m. The Chorale will perform in our Sanctuary and will be under the direction of former FPC Organist Dr. Christopher Samuel. Freewill donations will be received at the door.

Founded in 1988, the Valley Chamber Chorale is one of the longest running not-forprofit choral organizations in the Valley. The ensemble has performed at state conventions of the Music Educators National Conference,



in 1991 and 1995, the Western Region Convention of the American Guild of Organists in 1995, and the "World's Largest Organ Concert" with guest artist, Joan Lippincott, in 1996. The group's compact disc of Renaissance motets and madrigals, "O Sing Joyfully," was released in 1996, and can be found in bookstores locally and in select cities nationally. For the February 1st concert, the Chorale will be joined by a select group of high school singers!

The Reverend Yung Me Morris presented "Did You Eat Yet?" which focused on hospitality, epitomized by a history of hunger and starvation in Korea. Interestingly, it was American soldiers who helped the cause by "sharing" rations, namely discarded hotdogs and Spam, among other foods. To this day, Spam is a delicacy, even given in gift boxes and served in elaborately prepared dishes. Everyone enjoyed this thought-provoking presentation.

During November and December PW celebrates mission by donating to the Thank Offering – an opportunity to demonstrate gratitude for the special blessings in our lives. 


Mission
