The NJCC Professional Development LLC. is offering the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential & Quality Improvement Classes for Infant Toddler and Preschool caregivers. The onsite training is designed to provide the 120 -145 clock hours of professional development required by The Council for Professional Recognition to obtain the Child Development Associate credential. The classes will also be available for the infant and toddler CDA candidate's renewal. CDA classes will be offered twice a week for approximately one year.

- 18 years of age or older

Steps to follow during the CDA Course work:

The CDA Course includes assignments that lead participants through required steps to complete their CDA Professional Portfolio. Throughout the course, participants will:

- Identify and add items to the resource collection
- Write six reflective statements of competence, one for each CDA competency standard
- Write the professional philosophy statement
- Distribute the family questionnaire form
- Complete the family questionnaire summary sheet
- Prepare for the verification visit and CDA assessment

Course Schedule

Understanding Principles of Child Development & Learning

<u>Tuesday – CDA 101</u> Unit 1: Zero to Three – Brain Basics: This course covers unit 1 in the Zero to Three Growing Brains Curriculum. CDA Candidates will gain an understanding of how the brain develops, along with ways the provider can encourage healthy brain development in in children from birth to 5 years old. (3.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-471

<u>Thursday – CDA 102</u> Unit 2: Factors Affecting Brain Growth and Development (3.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-471

<u>Tuesday – CDA 103</u> Integrating Theories with How Children Learn Part 3 - This course provides an overview of prominent early childhood theorists and the role they played in the development of acceptable practice. Focus on how theories are included in daily activities. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-540

<u>Thursday – CDA 104</u> Integrating Theories with How Children Learn Part 4 - This course is a continuation that provides an overview of prominent early childhood theorists and the role they played in the development of acceptable practice. (3.5 hrs.) Class ID: 23-540

<u>Thursday</u> – Integrating Theories with How Children Learn Part 3 - This course provides an overview of prominent early childhood theorists and the role they played in the development of acceptable practice. Focus on how theories are included in daily activities. (2.0 hrs.) **Class ID:** 23-540

Competency Standard I Planning a Safe, Healthy Learning environment

<u>Tuesday – CDA 105</u> Creating and Maintaining a Safe Environment in the Infant & Toddler Classroom – Providers will explode and discuss ways to create an environment that allows for exploration, curiosity and developmentally appropriate. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-541

<u>Thursday – CDA 106</u> Creating and Maintaining a Safe Environment for Preschoolers – This course will give the participants ideas of setting up a safe and creative environment for preschool children. (Topics covered include toy safety, poison control, the development of appropriate play space, controlling high traffic areas in the classroom, and other safety standards for early childhood. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-541

<u>Tuesday – CDA 107</u> Creating and Maintaining a Safe Environment for Family Child Care Homes - This course will focus on exploring ways to setup a temporary learning center in spaces that have multiple uses. Emphasis will also be placed on "Safe Proofing Your Home for Child Care". (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-541

<u>Thursday – CDA 108</u> Creating & Maintaining a Safe Outdoor Setting – This course will explore ways to setup outdoor areas that will prevent or lesion accidents. We will also discuss creative ways to bring indoor activities and equipment to the outdoors. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-541

<u>Tuesday</u> – Planning a Safe Environment for Infants & Toddlers - In Addition, you will be working on resource files pertaining to prior competency goals. (2.0hrs.) Class ID: 23-541

Steps to Advance Children's Physical and Intellectual Development

<u>Tuesday – CDA 109</u> Promoting Motor Development and Physical Fitness in Early Childhood -This course provides an understanding of the importance of motor development and physical fitness in the early childhood years and the ways in which they can become part of the curriculum. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-543

<u>Thursday – CDA 110</u> Promoting Gross and Fine Motor Skills in Infants - This course will provide an understanding on gross and fine motor skills. This workshop will explain the difference between gross and fine motor skills that involve your babies using their large and small muscles. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-544

<u>Tuesday – CDA 111</u> Promoting Gross and Fine Motor Skills in Toddler - This course provides an understanding on gross and fine motor skills in toddlers. In this workshop you will gain a better understanding on the development of toddlers and how to spot red flags. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-544

<u>Thursday – CDA 112</u> Promoting Gross and Fine Motor Skills in Preschoolers - This course will provide an understanding on fine and gross motor skills for preschoolers. This workshop will explain how to encourage fine motor skills and creativity, as well as gross motor skills that include jumping, climbing, and balancing. (2.0 hrs.) **Class ID: 23-544**

<u>Tuesday – CDA 113</u> Encouraging Creativity in the Art Area: More than Paint – Focusing on "Hands-on" materials for art projects (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-544

<u>Thursday – CDA 114</u> Introducing Language Activities to Infants & Toddlers - This course assists the early childhood teacher in evaluating strategies and activities that promote language development in infants and toddlers. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 23-548

<u>Tuesday – CDA 115</u> Supporting Creativity through Language Art Activities - One key method to support creativity in children is to ensure that their learning involves as many senses as possible. Creativity involves a separation of the process of learning simply through visual information. Children are more prone to learn and retain knowledge when learning

activities or play involve touching, smelling, hearing, and tasting. This workshop will explore ways to promote creativity through language activities that include the dramatic play centers. (2.0 hrs.) **Class ID: 21-550**

Thursday – CDA 116 Understanding the Importance of Music in Early Childhood - The goal of this course is to provide an understanding of the importance of music in the early childhood years and the ways in which it can become part of the curriculum and of children's lives. (2.0 hrs.) **Class ID: 21-551**

Tuesday – CDA 117 Focusing on Practical Activities that Support Number Recognition, Counting, and Problem-solving Math for Preschoolers (NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) and GNJK model) - This workshop is designed to expose Preschool and Kindergarten teachers to innovative ways of teaching math concepts. Music, toys, and hands-on activities will assist you in producing instructional plans for your classroom. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 21-554

<u>Thursday – CDA 118</u> More than Counting - This session will discuss and implement ways to introduce math to young children. Activities will include games, gross motor activities that involve number concepts. (2.0 hrs.) Class ID: 21-555

(2.0 hrs.)
