Community of Akutan

Unangan (Aleut)

The Aleutian chain of islands have been inhabited by Unangan people for approximately 8,000 years. Akutan is the site of a traditional Unangan village. The Westernization of Akutan began in 1878 as a fur storage and trading port for the Western Fur & Trading Company. The company's agent established a commercial cod fishing and processing business that quickly attracted nearby Unangan to the community. A Russian Orthodox church and a school were built in 1878. Alexander Nevsky Chapel was built in 1918 to replace the original structure. The Pacific Whaling Company built a whale processing station across the bay from Akutan in 1912. It was the only whaling station in the Aleutians, and operated until 1939. After the Japanese attacked Unalaska in June 1942, the U.S. government evacuated Akutan residents to the Ketchikan area. The village was re-established in 1944, although many villagers chose not to return. This exposure to the outside world brought many changes to the traditional lifestyle and attitudes of the community. The City was incorporated in 1979. Location and Travel

Aleutian Islands—Between the Bering Sea and North Pacific Ocean

Akutan is located on Akutan Island in the eastern Aleutians, one of the Krenitzin Islands of the Fox Island group. It is 35 miles east of Unalaska, and 766 air miles southwest of Anchorage. It lies at approximately 54d 08m N Latitude, 165d 46m W Longitude (Sec. 11, T070S, R112W, Seward Meridian). The area encompasses 14 sq. miles of land and 4.9 sq. miles of water. Akutan lies in the maritime climate zone, with mild winters and cool summers. Mean temperatures range from 22 to 55. Precipitation averages 28 inches per year. High winds and storms are frequent in the winter, and fog is common in the summer.

Flights

The village of Akutan is located seven miles over open water from the airport on Akun Island. Regular flight service is provided by regional air carriers. Akutan can be reached by flying from Anchorage to Dutch Harbor (Unalaska) via RavnAir Group. Then fly Dutch Harbor to Akun Island with Grant Aviation, and from Akun Island to Akutan on Maritime Helicopters.

POPULATION

The Akutan community consists of two distinct populations: The traditional Alaska Native village; and the Trident Seafood Processing plant workers. The village population is about 100 people. There are approximately 400-600 year-round Trident employees, with seasonal workers bumping that up to 1,400 to 2,000 people.

ECONOMY

The subsistence economy includes fishing, hunting and food gathering. Also, Akutan hosts a number of businesses, primarily subsidiaries of the Akutan Corporation (an Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act village corporation) including a well-stocked store, hotel, and equipment rental. Jobs at the post office, school, city, bar, City operated daycare, lodge on Akun Island and Trident Seafoods provide cash income.

The Water Dam Impoundment project during the 2018 construction season helps provided safe, clean water source for the Akutan community. Partners providing funds include the City of Akutan and the US Department of Agriculture Rural Development grant and loan program.

Additionally, funds were provided by the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC). ANTHC also provided engineering and construction management services. This was a force account project through the City, meaning we were responsible for ensuring the hiring and training of local labor.


