Every Wednesday at 7am and 11am the Holy Eucharist is celebrated.



#### **Stamp Ministry**

Thank you to all the happy stampers who support this global ministry of ECW! We mailed 2, 624 stamps at the end of January that had been collected since May. That brought our donations for the year to 6.409. Our total donations, since we began this project in October 2021, now stands at 24,021.

The Alliance Stamp Ministry raised \$27,000 in 2024. As of the end of January 2025, they have generated \$2,000. Since the stamp ministry began in 1972, they have made \$1,218,300.00.

Please consider saving your postage stamps, no matter how few, for this great ministry! The money raised goes to support preparation, publication, and distribution of a Spanish language curriculum for Sunday Schools, More than 50 lesson series are being used in churches in 40 different denominations in America, Spain, and even the USA.

The stamp collection box is located on the table outside the church library. Please leave at least a 1/3" border around the stamp. Closely trimmed stamps do not sell for as much.

### About Ripe for Revival...

Ripe For Revival is a 501(c)3 non-profit out of Rocky Mount, NC that seeks to Revive Communities through Food. We know that food access is a serious problem; therefore, we have created a way to make fresh food available in areas and within communities in need that struggle with food insecurity or are considered a "food desert". Through our model, we take the excess produce that local farmers cannot sell and bring it to areas that lack access to it so not to waste it. In other words, we bridge the gap between farm excess and food access. We primarily do that through our Mobile Market Program with a fleet of buses and trailers that provide fresh produce, meat, dairy, and eggs at roughly 20-30% less than a retail grocery store. All markets are pay-what-you-can, which allows people from all backgrounds to shop with dignity. This year, we are working to provide pay-it-forward events where people from the community can shop on the market and pay it forward for others in their community. Ripe for Revival currently has 20 regular scheduled weekly mobile market events serving in 12 counties throughout Eastern and Central NC.

# MOBILE MARKET PROGRAM

Ripe For Revival's Mobile Market Program takes our mission on the road by utilizing large buses and trailers that have been transformed into pay-what-you-can retail markets. The Mobile Markets provide access to fresh and local food to areas that are considered "food deserts" while placing a strong focus on health and nutrition education, economic development, and empowerment of communities across North Carolina.





If you have "gently used" medical supplies you'd like to donate, the Purpose of God "Share Shop" will accept them. Items such as walkers, braces, shower chairs and wheel-chairs are appreciated.

The shop is open Monday-Thursday between the hours of 10:00am-1:00pm. It is located at 642 River Road, near Carly C's grocery store.
