Friends, after much discussion, we've decided that The Blessing Box will go on a 6-month hiatus. There are several reasons for this pause, but the primary reason is to adjust how we distribute food to better suit the needs of the community. After the hiatus and relocation closer to the Office, we will resume distributions through the Blessing Box.

Though this ministry is pausing, the hungry in our community are still crying out for food, and you can still provide it! Eagles Wings, a trusted partner of St. Peter's, is a shining light in our community and would greatly appreciate your volunteer hours and financial support. You can also volunteer at the Zion Shelter Soup Kitchen. Even more radically, you can invite the hungry into your home for a hot meal and a dose of dignity. The sky is the limit when it comes to what we can do for those in need in our midst.

The Early Church, in the Book of Acts, modeled what a faithful Christian community looks like: "Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need." (Acts 4:32-35)

What a compelling and challenging vision! A Church that wouldn't stand for people going hungry in its midst. A Church that would NOT tolerate an unfair distribution of wealth. This is a clarion call to us, the people of St. Peter's, to never stop looking for ways to assist the hungry, the hurting, and the poor of this world. While the Blessing Box is on hold, don't tire of

doing good; keep your eyes and ears open to hear the cries of the needy. In your heart is the power of the Risen Christ. Use it to change the world!


