I suppose I could have taken him or left him.

As I grew and spent time in the Gospel, I began to see him differently. He wasn't just a divine sacrifice on a cross. He was someone who hugged the diseased and reminded them of their sacred worth. He spent so much time with the drunkards and sex workers that people thought he was actually one of them. He spent time with the ones the world had set aside and forgotten. He was down in the gutter of the world, and there he seemed to find his happiness.

It's that image of Jesus that haunts me, that keeps me up at night, that draws me out of my own self-interest. Jesus, the one who cut through all suspension and discrimination to love those who had forgotten what love felt like. He defended the honor of women and children, to categories of people who actually had no legal standing in first-century Palestine.

I love this man. I absolutely love him. Can't you see the huge smile on his face as he held a leper and told him how beautiful he was? Can't you imagine the laughter erupting from his belly as he turned the world upside down and let a powerful world know that kindness is actually the best way to be human.

What do you love about Jesus? Ponder him now. Place him before your mind's eye and, as you gaze into him, let him gaze into you. Let him affirm your worth, your goodness. Let him infuse you with kindness, so you can infuse the world around you with that same kindness. Wage peace in a world of war.

The ECW is sponsoring a soup sale in October. We invite any cooks in the parish to make their favorite soup recipe and donate it to our sale. There will be quart containers and lids and instructions in the kitchen. You can prepare and freeze them at your convenience; as long as you get them to the kitchen freezer by October 17.

The proceeds of our sale will be donated to our Back Pack Buddies program and the Church Periodical Club. The CPC was started in 1888 in New York when a small group of women sent bundles of prayer books, Bibles, and church periodicals via Wells Fargo Stagecoach Line to missionaries in the Western United States. CPC is a ministry of the Episcopal Church and currently sends religious materials to hospitals, schools, prisons, and alcohol/drug abuse centers. It also offers grants to our seminarians to purchase books and school supplies.

Every member of our Parish is encouraged to cook as well as shop for soup to fill your freezer for the upcoming holidays. Sale is Sunday, October 19 after worship services.


