March 2026

The Apostle Paul once asked, "O death, where is your sting?" I do believe I have an answer for him: it is here, in our world, in our parish, in our midst.

Over the past two months, our parish has endured the deaths of many people we have loved so much. Four major funerals within such a short period are hard on a community. Loss is never easy, and it becomes even more difficult when it happens all at once. We have had little time to heal between these painful events, and when that happens, it's easy to feel overwhelmed by death, to feel more than just a sting.

Death is in our world as nations continue to make war with one another. The first attack in the Iran war was on a girls' school, carried out by an American offensive that makes the pain even harder to bear as we in our country must acknowledge this wrongdoing and call for peace and take action. This bloodshed and violence simply should not be.

When so much pain is felt, both around the world and here in Saint Peter's, it's all too easy to fall into fear, anger, or despair. We become paralyzed by the psychic pain of it all. We feel unmoored, unstable, and unable to find our own security and peace in a world bereft of it, and in a parish that has lost many of our loved ones so quickly.

What then do we do?

The first step we take is, well, nothing. There is no magic prayer, liturgy, or ritual that can heal pain like a salve on a wound. Certainly, these things can bring comfort, but it's not magic, and sometimes what once comforted us no longer does. When faced with so much pain and suffering in the world, the first step is to accept it. To accept the pain, the finality, the loss, the strangeness... to accept these things as immediately unavoidable. This eases the burden of action from us, for if we can accept that our pain can't be escaped, we won't keep searching for escape, whether through substances or religion.

The second thing to do is to decide...to decide how you want to live, what kind of person you want to be, and what virtues you want to embody. All that happens around us and all that happens to us, is ultimately not in charge of what we willingly choose to do or how we treat others. Regarding the pain in our community and the pain of so many losses, I choose not to retreat inwardly. I choose to stay connected with my neighbors and those who are hurting so we can collectively hold one another up. When it comes to the pain of the world, the pain of war, I commit to living as peacefully as possible and using my voice to speak out against injustice. It's better to light one candle than to curse the darkness. I do what I can, where I can, and that is the best I can do.

In this world, we are all just trying to do our best. I believe that about you, dear people of God. You are trying to do the best with what you have, what you know, and what the world keeps throwing your way. In this world of pain, which has tried its best to take the light of hope from us, we choose to move forward knowing that pain, and death, will not have the final word on our today, nor on our tomorrow. Death, in all its forms, both global and local, still stings. But that sting, no matter how deep the fangs sink in, is not fatal enough to keep us from walking in the light of hope. I believe that. Let's make it so.

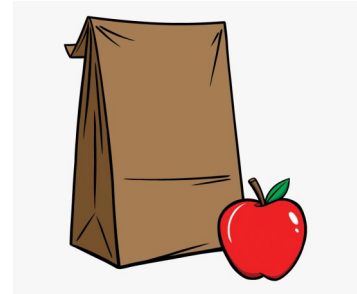

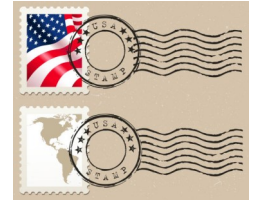

Stamp Ministry-Thank you to all the faithful stampers in our congregation! You helped Alliance Stamp Ministry raise \$40,000 in 2025! ECW recently mailed 2,042 stamps that were collected from mid-October through January. A small stamp collection that was donated to The Friends of the Brown Library book sale was sent in also but is not included in our total.

Please consider joining this fun ministry! Cut the stamps off your envelopes leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ "- $\frac{1}{2}$ " border around the stamp. Then just drop the stamps in the stamp box on the table outside the library.



Income from the sale of the stamps goes to support preparation, publication, and distribution of a Spanish language curriculum for Sunday Schools. More than 50 lesson series have been published and are being used in churches of 40 different denominations in Spanish speaking countries in Latin America, Spain, and the United States.

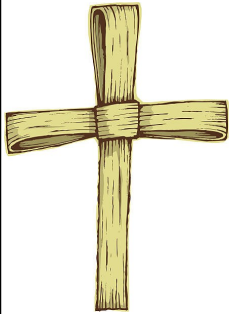

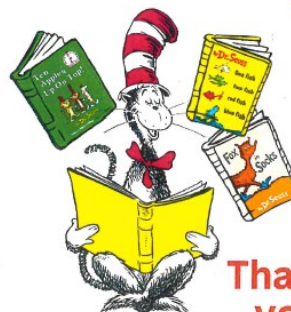

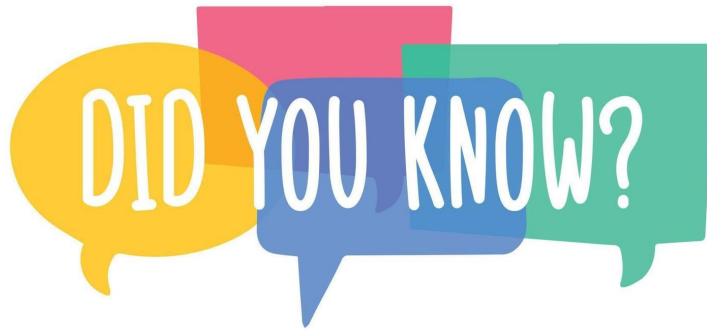

Divine Details for Curious Christians Angel Food Ministry

Did you know that St. Peter's has an Angel Food ministry? This ministry has been around for decades and coordinates meal assistance for parishioners who need a little extra help due to the variety of curveballs that life throws our way.

Angel Food is currently comprised of six teams that average five to six members each (give or take). These teams typically have two leaders who are responsible for reaching out to the church office just one month per year to find out if any of St. Peter's parishioners need assistance. This is generally one meal for members of the parish who have come home from the hospital, are sick or homebound, have a baby, broken bone, etc.

When it becomes known that a St. Peter's family or parishioner may need meal assistance, the Angel Food team lead for that month contacts that person to find out if they do need help, what sort of help, and any dietary restrictions or preferences. The team for that month then gets to work coordinating the meal and drop-off.

The ministry teams would like to remind us that many people do not ask for help, so if you ever hear of or know of a parishioner who could use a little help with meals during a tough time, please do not hesitate to reach out to the church office at 252-946-8151.

"A couple of our Angel Food teams could also use extra helping hands due to members who have recently moved out of our area," said Angel Food lead Emily Garner. "We ask that you prayerfully consider joining our ministry, as it truly takes very little time out of our busy schedules, especially when our teams have plenty of help. Since I took the reins from Jean Sterling in August 2025, our teams have served an average of one family or parishioner a month."
