In a recent article in the Washington Daily News, I shared how I'm keeping the tradition of Old English Christmas at my house this year. Drive by my house on Market Street, and you'll notice that the lights are still lit. If you slow down, you can peek into my front room and see that our tree is still standing, illumined by the 200 glorious LED bulbs that adorn it in between ornamental memories and pieces of plastic joy. It goes until February 2nd, the Feast of Candlemas, the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. Take your pick of names. All of them name the same celebration, memorializing the moment the baby Jesus was taken to the temple for the first time after Mary was finally allowed to enter, no longer being seen as unclean due to giving birth. In medieval England, the celebrations of Christmas were kept until Candlemas as a way of highlighting the absolute wildness of our story. Jesus was God in the flesh who has redeemed us by suffering alongside of us. Of course, we ought to celebrate it with exuberance and gusto! You don't have to keep Old English Christmas to honor and celebrate this feast, but I challenge you to think about how you will carry this Christmas and Epiphany joy with you throughout the year so that people see and witness the power of the Gospel. I challenge you to live a life infused with the energy of Christmas, an energy of self-giving love. Let's keep celebrating this illuminating beauty in a world of shadow.
