Recent investigations of several tragic events have repeatedly identified the absence of a culture of safety as a common contributing factor. An organization's safety culture is a collective reflection of the ethical implications of individual decisions made by its workforce. Safety culture, good or bad, is the sum of many individual ethical decisions, yet the notion of ethical safety decision-making is rarely discussed. This presentation will describe ethical dilemmas safety professionals can encounter and how the decisions they make can impact an organization's overall safety culture. Fatigue remains one of the most under-recognized yet costly risks in the workplace, contributing to nearly 13% of injuries and billions in claims annually. Beyond delayed reaction times and impaired judgment, fatigue interacts with behavioral health factors such as depression, anxiety, and substance use. This session combines occupational medicine and behavioral health perspectives to reveal how fatigue and mental health overlap, amplify safety risks, and impact long-term worker well-being.

Drawing on case studies from various industries, Dr. Scott Cherry (occupational & preventive medicine physician) and Dr. Les Kertay (clinical psychologist and behavioral health consultant) will outline practical frameworks for identifying fatigue-related risks and connecting them to mental health drivers. Attendees will learn evidence-based mitigation strategies including schedule optimization, microbreaks, fatigue screening protocols, and approaches to reduce stigma and encourage open reporting of behavioral health concerns.

This presentation will provide background on the High-Consequence Infectious Disease (HCID) that has elicited domestic response over the last five years (e.g., MERS-CoV, Nipah virus, Ebola, Lassa Fever) and our industrial hygiene research in the area, including but not limited to: current U.S. levels of preparedness to address HCID and domestic infrastructure, considerations for the selection of decontamination products and procedures at the Nebraska Biocontainment after The treatment of 3 evacuated Ebola-confirmed patients, air and ground transport considerations to prevent occupational exposure, Category A waste handling, laboratory considerations, and risk communication. We will also discuss the invaluable role industrial or occupational hygienists can have in this area.
