Are today's carbon monoxide (CO) alarms truly protecting everyone—or are critical risks still being missed? In this session, Michael Larrañaga, PhD, PE, CIH, FAIHA, managing partner of REM Risk Consultants, will present key findings from the recently completed “Carbon Monoxide Alarm and Detection” report—an in-depth literature review conducted by his team for the Fire Protection Research Foundation and supported by industry and safety stakeholders. This research explores the latest science on CO exposure across different populations, raising vital questions about whether current alarm thresholds do enough to safeguard infants, seniors, and other vulnerable groups from injury or death. These insights could help shape the future of detection standards, product design, and public safety strategies—moving us closer to the goal of eliminating CO poisoning altogether.

This presentation will highlight the value of company-wide training initiatives and focus on Spring Pause as a key example of how proactive planning can reduce seasonal risks. Spring Pause was developed in response to an observed trend: as fieldwork increases in the spring, so does exposure to specific environmental and operational hazards. We'll explain what Spring Pause means—an intentional, company-wide campaign to refocus on safety—and Walk through how we selected topics relevant across the U.S. while tailoring content to regional hazards. The initiative incorporates elements such as risk assessment, foresight, psychological safety, and fit-for-duty awareness to strengthen both physical and mental preparedness.
