CRITICAL NEED FOR STREET REPS - AT LEAST READ THIS

Every resident in Florida Gardens is a member of the Florida Gardens Civic Association, Inc. The Association is governed by a representative Board of Directors, which consists of five elected Officers, three appointed Directors at Large, and 19 Street Representatives. The Street Reps are the voice of the residents. Their input helps shape the function, activities and direction of the Corporation. Without their representation, the residents have no voice. But as critical as the position of Street Rep is, it takes very little time or effort. You don't even have to be a resident of the street you represent (although that is always the preference). The 'duties' of a Street Rep are simple and outlined in the By-Laws. First, since you represent the residents, attend the monthly Residents Meeting. There are only 10 (we don't meet in July or August) and last about an hour or less. There can even be two people acting as a Street Rep for a street - a Primary and a Secondary so if one can't make it the other can take their place. Second, the Street Rep is responsible for insuring that the community Newsletter, published 5 times per year, gets delivered to all the houses on the street. This doesn't mean you have to do it yourself (but it is a good way to connect with the people you represent). If necessary, you can find someone to do it for you. Your responsibility is simply that it gets done. That's about it. So why, with an average of about 44 houses per street, is it so difficult to find a few people willing and able to support this community by filling the current and pending Street Rep vacancies? If this simple but vital activity is something you would be willing to volunteer for, please contact Mike Misko.

Lucerne Lakes Golf Course Conversion Update

As mentioned in the November Newsletter, the anticipated fight to retain the Lucerne Lakes Golf Course (or convert it into natural space) has moved to the courts. A coalition of Lucerne Lakes residents has been formed to coordinate the effort and they have retained a law firm to represent them. Several documents have been uncovered that were generated when ownership of the property was turned over which clearly state that the land must be used for recreational use "in perpetuity". Conversion of the property to residential housing would violate that restriction, and that is the basis for their argument. On 12/23/21, the law firm that has been retained filed a request for two rulings from the court. One is a Declaratory Judgement where the court would acknowledge the binding validity of those documents, and the second is an Injunction prohibiting the attempt to convert the land. The court case has been initiated with the next step in the process expected in mid-February. In order to fund the effort, the group has been soliciting donations from their residents. They currently have a goal of \$125K and have secured about \$30K of that so far. They have recently set up a GoFundMe page to assist in the fund raising effort. The link to that page is:

CHANGE IN CLUBHOUSE RENTAL RATES

Inflation has taken its toll on our operating budget. We rely on income from Clubhouse rentals and Member Contributions to pay our expenses. The Clubhouse rentals do not cover the total cost of Clubhouse operations. To help with this yet not significantly impact the residents who wish to rent the Clubhouse, we are therefore going to raise the rental rates as follows:

Resident rentals will increase only slightly, from \$220 currently to \$250. This amount includes both the new base rental cost (\$234.74) and 6.5% sales tax (\$15.26). Note that sales tax is comprised of state tax on commercial rental space at 5.5% plus the 1.0% discretionary sales tax imposed by Palm Beach County. The refundable security deposit amount (\$200) will not change.

Non-resident rentals will increase from \$850 currently to \$1000. It was noted at the meeting that we often get comments from our outside renters how very inexpensive our Clubhouse is to rent compared to other facilities in the area. We believe that this increase will have no effect on the number of outside renters interested in our facility. The new \$1000 amount includes both the new base rental cost (\$938.97) plus 6.5% sales tax (\$61.03) as explained above. Again, the refundable security deposit amount (\$500 for outside renters) will not change.

The new rental rates will take effect on new contracts beginning immediately.
