HONOR OUR VETERANS - Once again this year, on the Sunday before Memorial Day, volunteers will place flags on every one of the 30,000 graves currently in the South Florida National Cemetery on State Road 7. It's a massive effort. Drive through the cemetery some time during Memorial Day week to see all 30,000 headstones each adorned with an American flag and pay your respects. The flags are removed Saturday.

Flying the Flag on Memorial Day - Full-Staff after Noon, Moment of Silence at 3:00 pm.

Just a reminder, per the U.S. Flag Code, on Memorial Day the flag is flown at half-staff until noon only, at which time it is raised to full-staff. We also honor the memory of our military heroes with a National Moment of Remembrance at 3:00 p.m, for one minute.



ANNUAL CONTRIBUTION STATUS

In the January Newsletter, we kicked off our annual contribution drive. We detailed how your contributions fund the various community activities and children's holiday parties. We asked that you check with your friends that live in HOA communities and see what they pay annually in mandatory HOA dues and what they receive in return. We also have a safe, simple method to make a contribution online through our website or even on your phone if you have the Venmo app if a mailed check is too inconvenient.

As of May 10th, we have the lowest contribution rate we have had in several years. Only 181 of our 782 households in Florida Gardens have recognized the need for their involvement and have been generous enough to contribute. Most have contributed \$50. Some have contributed more. To everyone who has contributed thus far, we say THANK YOU!

We try to maximize our contribution receipts at the beginning of the year so we have some idea of the money available to fund the organization for the year, however you can make a contribution at any time. All contributions received, regardless of the receipt date, are for the calendar year in which they are received. The Association fiscal year runs from Jan 1st to Dec 31st.

Please consider what this great community has to offer and, if you have not yet done so, make a donation to help keep our activities funded.

REMINDER : We have several ways to contribute. You can make your annual contribution to the Florida Gardens Civic Association by a check mailed to the Association at 134 Ohio Road. You can use any credit card online from our website (floridagardens.net). Simply select "CONTRIBUTE" from the main menu and follow the directions. Finally, new this year, you can also pay using Venmo. Enter @Floridagardensca as payee. If prompted, use 0541 as the last 4 digits of the payee phone.

A FEW PRE-HURRICANE SEASON PREP ITEMS.

Unfortunately, it's that time of year again. We have been fortunate to have avoided any major storms for several years now. We have many new residents who perhaps have never experienced a hurricane, and some who may have forgotten some basic preparatory checks to complete. Here are a few important things to do BEFORE the season arrives so that any problems can be addressed:

<u>Accordion Shutter Check</u> - For those of you who have accordion shutters - a word of caution. These shutters need regular (yearly) maintenance to make sure they are ready to be closed in the event of a storm. If you have not checked your shutters yet this year, do it now before the storm threatens. Simply go around and close and lock, then re-open every shutter to be sure they will work easily when needed. The worst offenders are the type that have the aluminum rods that engage in holes in the upper and lower tracks. These rods usually have stainless steel thumbscrews to keep them in place, which, if they have not been lubricated periodically, will seize and prevent the rods from moving. If you have this type of shutter, please check them and make sure they are all loose. If you don't have the lock keys handy, find them now and check that the locks work. Some types of accordion shutters rely only on the locking handle to keep them closed. Accordion shutters are great, but only if they are in working order. Make sure yours are.

<u>Generators</u> - Many of us have a generator sitting in the garage, but unless it's been maintained it may not function when you need it. Generators should be operated at least about every 4-6 months and stored properly. With the season approaching, take the time now to fire up your generator (ethanol-free fuel recommended) and make sure it works. If it does, fully drain the fuel and follow the manufacturer's instructions for proper storage. Also, be sure you have motor oil for your generator. Reminder: If you purchased a new generator or stored your existing one empty (you shouldn't), make sure you buy enough crankcase oil for it. New generators don't come with oil in them. They generally use a little less than 2 quarts of SAE-30 weight oil. Don't use multi-viscosity oil. Consult the owner's manual to see exactly how much oil you will need. If your generator engines should have the oil changed after a certain number of operating hours (my manual recommends every 25-50 hours of operation depending on load). If we're without power for a week and you run your generator full time, you should plan on 3 oil changes. Make sure you have enough oil on hand for that.

<u>Hurricane Panels</u> - If you have panels or other window coverings, make sure they are accessible and that you have all the necessary installation hardware handy. You don't want to be searching for that bag or can of wing nuts at the last minute.

<u>Assistance</u> - Some residents may need assistance with labor-intensive tasks such as hurricane shutters. Now is the time to identify a family member, neighbor, friend, or someone else you can rely on to come and assist you if you need help with these tasks. It is not uncommon to hear stories of people who paid labors large fees to install shutters at the last minute (and sometimes larger fees to have them removed). Identify your help now and check with them well before a potential storm threat becomes a reality.
