
LUCERNE LAKES GOLF COURSE ELIMINATION UPDATE

As most of you probably know by now, the Palm Beach County Zoning Commission met on September 2nd and voted 6-1 to recommend to the Board of County Commissioners that Mattamy Homes be allowed to proceed with the conversion of the Lucerne Lakes golf course to residential housing. The Board of County Commissioners will meet on September 29th for a final vote.

The approved plan is the third major iteration. On the plus side, the number of residential units to be added was reduced back to 450 and another access to Lucerne Lakes will be added off of Charleston Street (the road to the east that the fire station is on). However, a surprise change that will impact Florida Gardens was the reconfiguration of the intersection of Ohio Road and Columbia Road (the small connector road between Florida Gardens and Lucerne Lakes). The reconfiguration will widen Ohio Road there to the west to allow for the addition of a 150' left turn lane from southbound Ohio Road onto Columbia Road. This will affect the 5 property owners on the west side of Ohio and will be of little to no benefit to us. It will not address the ongoing issue of Lucerne Lakes residents cutting through Florida Gardens along Springdale to bypass the traffic lights on Lake Worth Road.

Unfortunately, with a 6-1 recommendation to the Board of Commissioners, it is unlikely that they will deny the project.





A question was raised at this past month's Residents Meeting regarding the possibility of the County wanting to extend Ohio Road south across the canal to Lantana Road to help alleviate traffic congestion on Lake Worth Road. Ohio Road aligns with 2nd Road south of the canal. However, here's what would be required to have that happen. First and foremost, while there is road right-of-way for Ohio extending up to the canal, there is no road right-of-way on the south side of the canal leading to 2nd Road. There is only a narrow maintenance path from 2nd Road between two homes that allows for access to the canal and the large pipes which span it. To create enough space for a road on the south side of the canal, the County would have to purchase and demolish 2 houses, one on each side of the maintenance path. The pipes over the canal would likely need to be relocated to construct the bridge. Also, 2nd Road does not currently fully extend to Lantana Road. It terminates at Cocoanut Road (yes, that's how it's spelled), three blocks away from Lantana Road. There is however road right-of-way between the houses on those three blocks so 2nd Road could be extended between those houses to Lantana Road. Thus, while the extension of Ohio Road south to Lantana Road is technically possible, it does not seem likely that a simple 2-lane connection would be worth the expense even after adding the traffic from all the approved and future development along Lake Worth Road.
