Pasta with Salmon, Peas & Dill

Coated in a butter-white wine sauce, this delicious meal is a fresh take on pasta primavera featuring roasted salmon and snappy English peas.



Ingredients

- · Cooking spray
- · 12 oz. salmon fillets, skin removed
- · 1 tsp. whole coriander, crushed
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 lb. cavatappi or other short pasta
- 8 oz. fresh or frozen English peas
- 4 tbsp. unsalted butter, cut into pieces
 1/2 yellow onion, chopped
- 1/2 c. dry white wine
- · 3 tbsp. fresh dill, torn

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly grease a small baking sheet. Season salmon with coriander, salt, and pepper. Roast on prepared baking sheet until cooked through, 13 to 15 minutes. Transfer to a plate. Cool completely, then flake into large pieces.
- Meanwhile, cook pasta according to package directions, adding peas during last 1 (if using frozen) to 4 (if using fresh) minutes. Reserve 1 cup cooking water; drain. Return pasta to pot.
- Melt 2 tablespoons butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onion and season with salt
 and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until tender, 6 to 8 minutes. Add wine and cook until
 syrupy, 3 to 4 minutes. Add pasta and 1/2 cup reserve cooking water. Bring to a simmer. Remove
 from heat and stir in remaining 2 tablespoons butter (adding additional cooking water if needed
 to create a sauce). Gently fold in dill and salmon. Serve hot or cold...enjoy!


Florida Gardens Residents Only, Please

LUCERNE LAKES GOLF COURSE CONVERSION UPDATE

On May 26th, Mattamy Homes went before the Palm Beach County Commissioners to request approval for the establishment of a Community Development District on the Lucerne Lakes property. A CDD is a government-controlled entity which allows a developer to sell municipal bonds to finance the infrastructure (roads, drainage, etc.) needed to support their development project rather than having to get business loans or finance the infrastructure themselves the way large developers do with the cost simply added to the sales price of the home. Instead, the payoff of the bonds is amortized over 30 years and added to the home buyer's property taxes, theoretically lowering the up-front sales price of the home. By incorporating the bond payments into the property taxes, the government (in this case the County) would become responsible for debt collection and payment. While other counties in Florida have embraced this arrangement, Palm Beach County has only recently considered it on a small number of new developments. It was a somewhat contentious meeting and a postponement was suggested, but in the end a motion was made and vote taken. The Commissioners voted 4-to-3 to DENY Mattamy's request for a CDD.

Next, Mattamy petitioned the Lake Worth Drainage District to abandon the District's drainage easements. The Drainage District denied this request as well.

Finally, the battle against the conversion is continuing in court. Mattamy, as expected, has submitted to the court motion after motion, each requiring a legal response and costing Lucerne additional legal fees. As a result, the Lucerne Lakes community continues to struggle to raise the money for the lawyer's funds, and as a result found it necessary to change to another legal firm. They need funds to pay for the lawyers. To support their fund raising efforts, they have a GoFundMe page. If you would like to donate to their struggle, the link to that page is

RECYCLING: WHERE PLASTIC ACTUALLY ENDS UP

That plastic container you toss in a recycling bin? Odds are today you're actually doing very little for the environment. The packaging could end up in a landfill in the U.S. or pay to be shipped abroad and burned. Micro-plastic particles from incineration are showing up in the air, the rain, and even in human blood.

While some used plastic is shipped to recycling facilities, the truth is most products put in U.S. recycling bins don't go where Americans think they do. Environmental advocates have long encouraged citizens to "reduce, reuse, recycle." But many experts say it's important to be realistic about the global recycling industry. Here's where your recycling really goes.

There's no federal recycling program in the U.S. Where your household recycling goes depends on the material and where you live. "Every town has different policies," said Nilda Mesa of Columbia University. Curbside recycling is typically collected by a private company or municipality and taken to a sorting plant where marketable materials are salvaged. "In some cases, a city may make money off recycling categories such as cardboard and lose money on glass. It depends on the market," Mesa said.

Many items end up in the recycling stream that aren't recyclable, causing contamination. "Often, householders put products into the recycling container that they 'wish' could be recycled," said Joe Pickard, chief economist for the Institute of Scrap Recycling Industries. Contamination includes products that can't be recycled, aren't accepted in a specific area or are contaminated by residual container contents, he said. "These contaminated items most often simply go to the landfill," he added. It is common for facilities to have contamination rates in the 15-20% range, Pickard said.

Among recyclables, cardboard, paper and metal are usually recycled at high rates, said Jan Dell, an engineer and founder of The Last Beach Cleanup, an environmental organization. It's plastic, which is largely made from petroleum, that wreaks havoc, she said. Just 9% of all plastic waste ever created has been recycled, researchers estimate.

Plastic packaging is typically labeled with a resin identification code – that chasing arrows symbol with a number 1 through 7. Plastic items made from #1 (think soda and water bottles) and #2 (for things like laundry detergent and milk containers) are the most widely recyclable, experts said. Other types of plastic simply aren't profitable to recycle in the United States. "Most all of plastic waste isn't safely recyclable, and it is wrecking the recycling system," Dell said. The U.S. produces more plastic waste than any other country and actually pays to send some plastic waste abroad. These plastic exports are largely waste from consumers, as opposed to plastic scrap from making products, Dell said.

"Waste that is being generated in the United States is ping-ponging across the globe," said Claire Arkin, global communications lead for the Global Alliance for Incinerator Alternatives. "Nobody wants our plastic crap." About half of plastic waste collected for recycling worldwide was traded internationally back in 2016, a study in the journal Science Advances found. That year, the U.S. paid to export 1.99 million metric tons of plastic scrap to 89 trade partners, with the vast majority exported to China. Of that, up to 75% was inadequately managed in receiving countries, the study estimated. U.S. plastic scrap shipped to China was largely burned or dumped, Dell said. But the game changed in 2018, when China enacted its "National Sword" policy, which banned the importation of dozens of types of solid waste and set contamination limits on recyclable materials. In the following years, the U.S. started sending more of its plastic waste to Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia and Vietnam, and in smaller amounts to Turkey, Ecuador, the Philippines, Bangladesh, Ghana, Cambodia and Senegal, according to a 2019 investigation by The Guardian. Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam later restricted imports.

"Plastic pollution isn't just like an eyesore. It's a biodiversity, human health, human rights issue when it comes down to it because it disproportionately targets the Global South, economically challenged communities and people of color," said Kaitlyn Trent of Greenpeace. Now more countries in Latin America are emerging as destinations for global plastic waste, a 2020 study found. Last year, the U.S. exported 74,000 shipping containers of plastic waste to 15 low-income Latin American countries. Most went to Mexico, followed by El Salvador. The countries where it ends up have few environmental regulations, limited water to clean plastic and no capacity to treat the chemicals. They end up burning the waste and polluting the air and water. A number of global initiatives in recent years have aimed to address the issue, but waste trade remains rampant.




