





#### CLUBHOUSE RENTAL RATES FOR FLORIDA GARDENS RESIDENTS TO RISE IN 2026.

Given that our annual resident contributions have failed to keep pace with rising operating costs, after discussions at the June Residents Meeting, a motion was made that we raise the rental rates for resident rentals (only). The vote by the full Board of Directors was nearly unanimous. The new rates will be \$400 on Saturday and \$350 on Sunday. Here is the justification:

For many years now, we have had a \$250 rate for Saturday and \$200 for Sunday rentals to Florida Gardens residents. With increasing expenses for maintenance and supplies, the replacement of the air conditioning system last year and deferred improvements like the needed kitchen renovation, we have little choice but to increase our basic Saturday and Sunday residents rental rates. We will keep the non-residents Saturday rate at \$1000.

The Saturday resident rental rate will increase to \$400 (from \$250), 8:00 am to 11:00 pm. The Sunday resident rate will increase to \$350 (up from \$200), 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. These rate increases begin 1/1/26 since all remaining dates are already booked through the end of the year. Rental rates to outside renters remain the same. Rentals for 2026 dates already under contract will not change.


#### FLORIDA GARDENS ISSUES RELATED TO THE LUCERNE LAKES REDEVELOPEMENT :

Mattamy paid the County \$166,384 over a year ago for the County to assume responsibility for the design and construction of the turn lane. As of this writing, County Engineering has still not finalized the design.

## THIS IS THE FINAL FULL-FORMAT NEWSLETTER. QUARTERLY BULLETINS BEGIN IN JANUARY

Back in May, I published an article titled "A PROPOSAL TO END THE PRINT VERSION OF THIS NEWSLETTER". In the article, I articulated the reasons why I felt it was time to transition the current 12-page publication to an ad-free digital only format which would be posted on our Website and also made available via the other social media platforms we use to disseminate neighborhood information (Nextdoor, Facebook and Instagram). Perhaps it was reflective of the limited number of residents who actually look at the Newsletter when they receive it, but I received absolutely no feedback, positive or negative, to the article. At the June Residents Meeting, the members of the Board of Directors who were present discussed the issue. The biggest concern raised was the fact that the distributed January and March issues were the main (actually only) vehicle by which information on how the essential annual residents financial contributions could be made. Those Newsletters contained a preaddressed envelope which could be used by residents who elected to make a contribution by check (which almost 70% of those 110 residents who did contribute used). There was also concern that without a distributed Newsletter, residents would not be made aware of the dates of the 3 main kids party events (at Easter, Halloween and Christmas). These concerns were offset by the amount of volunteer time and effort needed to generate the 12-page ad-driven Newsletter in its current form. At the September Residents Meeting, all these issues were again discussed and the following decisions were reached:

This November Newsletter is the final one in its current form unless there is someone else (or a group of people) willing to assume the involved task of its financing, generation and distribution. As mentioned in the May article, the cost of printing the current full-color, 12-page Newsletter is over \$1,000 for every issue, generated 5 times per year. Instead, we will generate and distribute a simple 4-page Bulletin beginning in January. This 4-page Bulletin will cost less than \$500. The January Bulletin will concentrate on our annual contribution drive which funds the neighborhood kids parties, the scholarships we award and the general operating expenses of the Association. We will still include a preaddressed envelope for mailing contributions for those who prefer that method. The remaining space will contain general neighborhood information. An expanded version of the bulletin will appear online. There will be no advertisements. A Bulletin in late March/ early April will detail the planned Easter events, the status of the contributions received and other neighborhood news. Again, an expanded bulletin will appear online. The September Bulletin will detail the planned Halloween events and the November issue will list the planned Christmas events. We will try this for 2026 and assess its impact to determine if changes are necessary to achieve the desired goals.

I have voluntarily generated the content of the current Newsletter since 2018 and have agreed to shepherd this transition. I will still generate the content. Keegan Gwin has graciously taken over the distribution task of getting packets of the 2026 Bulletins to each of the Street Reps for them to distribute to the residents on their respective streets.


