Syllabus

Introduction and Course Description

The purpose of Prayer Revolution Bible Institute is to train leaders for the church and other places of ministry. The institute is designed to provide a Bible college-level training at no charge to the student, so that anyone with the desire to learn can get a Bible education. God calls all believers to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the systematic study and application of God's Word is the best way to grow spiritually. The Core Curriculum consists of six modules that progressively lead the student from the basic principles of Christianity to active evangelism. The Bible Exposition Courses build upon that foundation with a deeper knowledge and understanding of the truths of God's Word. These Bible Exposition courses are upper-level courses and contain a certain level of difficulty for the new student. Although each course is designed to be completed in fifteen weeks, the beauty of a self-paced online education is that the student can dictate his or her own pace.

Prayer Revolution Bible Institute is not accredited at this time and therefore does not offer credit, nor a college diploma. The student who completes the recommended course of learning, however, will have the personal satisfaction of achieving a good Bible education that will reap spiritual blessing and reward.

Course Description

BE 470 Minor Prophets 1

(Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, and Micah)

Learn timely lessons from the past as you study the first six Books of the Minor Prophets. The book of Hosea describes Hosea's marriage to his unfaithful wife. The book of Joel calls the nation of Judah to repent. The Book of Amos called Israel to repent of its luxurious living, idolatry, and moral depravity. Obadiah pronounced judgment upon the nation of Edom for its violence against Israel. The Book of Jonah records Jonah's call and reluctance to warn the city of Nineveh of impending judgment. Micah criticized the rich who exploited the poor and the prophets who ministered for money.

Prerequisites

While students are encouraged to take all of the Core Curriculum classes before taking any of the Bible Exposition Courses, this choice is not required. The Institute is designed to be flexible to meet the needs of the student according to the student's own needs and goals. The only requirement for a Bible Exposition Course is that the student must have completed CC 180 Old Testament Survey before taking an Old Testament Bible Exposition Course and CC 190 New Testament Survey before taking a New Testament Exposition Course. Therefore, the prerequisite for this course is CC 180 Old Testament Survey.

Bible Reading Assignments

Students will be required to read each chapter of the book of the Bible that is covered in that Bible Exposition Course. While students are only required to read each chapter one time, it is recommended that the student read each chapter twice as time allows.

Constable, and are made available free of charge in pdf format by special arrangement with the author for students of Prayer Revolution Bible Institute. Examinations and Major Assignments


Exams consist of questions on each chapter of the Bible that is covered in the course. Questions are made available by special arrangement with Enlightener.org. and are protected by Copyright law. The exams for this course are as listed below.

To take the examinations,

- 1) Click on the MID-TERM EXAM link or FINAL EXAM link or go to http://www.enlightener.org/BibleStudy.htm
- 2) Select OT or NT. (Old Testament or New Testament)
- 3) Select the "Q" beside the Book of the Bible that you have been studying.
- 4) On a separate sheet of paper, answer the questions for the Bible chapters that you have been studying. All questions come straight from the Bible reading and do not come from the textbook or lectures, although the textbook or lectures may answer the same questions.



All exams are OPEN BOOK, which means you may find the answers to these questions in your Bible while you are taking the test. The purpose of the class is to learn the material, and an open book test still accomplishes this objective. However, students are asked to NOT look at the answers until they are finished with the test. Students may not search the internet during the exam to find the answers to the test. Students may NOT ask others for their help or input during the exam. The Bible is the only reference that may be used during an exam.

- 5) Grade the exam. Select the "A" that accompanies that exam. Use your honest judgement as to whether you have the correct answer. You may give yourself half-credit for answers that are partially correct. Beginning with a grade of 100, subtract two points for each incorrect answer. If you are not satisfied with your grade, you may study the material for a full week and then re-take the test. Keep the second exam grade. Again, the purpose of the course is to increase your knowledge of the material, and a week review of the material will help to accomplish this goal if needed.
- 6) Place a final grade at the top of your paper.

Save your tests for your own records. Prayer Revolution Bible Institute does not maintain any student records. Exams make up the only grades for this course. To get your final course grade at the end of the course, add the three exam grades together and divide by 3. For example, an 86 and a 92 added together and divided by 2 would equal 89, or B+. To determine your cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) in the institute, add together all of your final course grade point equivalents and divide by the number of courses you have taken so far. For example, if you took five courses, and the final grades were B+, C+, A, A-, and A+, then the grade point equivalents would be 3.3, 2.3, 4, 4, and 4. The total is 17.6. Divided by 5, the GPA would be 3.52 up to this point. **No grades are reported to the Institute.**

Study Habits

It is usually expected that students will spend approximately 1 to 2 hours of study time for each daily assignment in addition to listening to any audio lectures. Since this is a 3-unit class, you should expect to study an average of 3 to 6-hours each week. Some students may need more study time and some less. Since this course is self-paced, students may not be able to go at the accelerated rate and may need to take longer than fifteen weeks to complete this course, which is fine. It is better to take longer to finish the course than to not finish at all.
