Local LGBTQ+ Affirming Mental Health Resources

Emergency Services: Call 911 or go to Emergency Room (Shasta County Regional Center)

- Crisis Residential & Recovery Center: (530) 225-5972
 - This center provides short term respite for mentally disabled adults who have become suicidal, critically depressed or otherwise psychiatrically incapacitated. The center serves as a social rehabilitation facility, and services avert the need for hospitalization. Stays are voluntary for up to 30 days. Services include: daily groups focused on wellness and recovery, coping skills, medication treatment, education, daily living activities, peer support, and other topics as needed. Hours: Always Open. Referral through Shasta County Menta Health Outpatient.

Accepts all types of insurance. Can help deescalate the person in crisis and develop a plan for long term treatment. Mental health clinicians, social workers, and peer support on site. • Mobile Crisis Outreach Team: (530) 238-7133 (Urgent Response) (530) 238-7134 The Hill Country Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT) provides on-the-spot urgent mental health services to people suffering severe mental illness. MCOT will respond to crisis situations in many locations within the Shasta County area, from people's homes to the streets. Most crisis situations when safety is not an issue. The team can help with: Suicidal talk or behavior, bizarre, manic or psychotic behavior, extreme anxiety or panic, severe depression or hopelessness, Initiating hospitalization (5150) when appropriate. M-F 8:30a-7p. When calling to activate the team please be prepared with the following information: Your name and phone number, name, date of birth, and location of the person of concern, a description of the person and situation, current risks and any other important information.

Peer Support Specialists are people who live with mental illness or who have a loved one with mental illness they have supported through the process and have learned how to get well and stay well. They bring with them the insight they've gained from their personal journeys with mental health recovery. They provide support to clients in several different settings, including affordable housing, such as The Woodlands, board and care homes such as Le Brun, Sail House, Gilmore House, RidgeView, the Crisis Residential Recovery Center and local inpatient psychiatric facilities like Restpadd and Shasta Regional Medical Center's Center for Behavioral Health. Caring Choices offers HIV Programs to provide those affected by HIV/AIDS multiple levels of assistance through case management and direct assistance. Services provided include: AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) —provides medications at no cost for eligible individuals, HIV Care Program (HCP)—provides case management by Registered Nurses and Social Workers to assist with medical, social, financial and emotional aspects of living with HIV/AIDS, Housing Assistance for People with AIDS (HOPWA), AIDS Medi-Cal Waiver Program

We assist with referrals to services such as dental, nutrition, and mental health as well as referrals to medication assistance program, food programs, support groups and much more.
