

Registration: Registration from 9.00am. Register at the farmyard and then proceed to the course assembly area at Forthill woods. **Practice area** There will be 2 practice bosses: a boss with 20cm/40cm faces, and a boss with a 60cm face. **Event Timings End of Shoot:** On completing the shoot, please proceed to registration and hand in your score cards. Please ensure they are fully completed as failure to do so may invalidate your score. If you are claiming a record or arrowhead, please complete the paper slip given with your score cards and hand it along with your score card before leaving the venue. We would ask that once you have completed the shoot you that you leave the venue. (sorry it does sound harsh). There is no medal ceremony and scores will be sent by e-mail and medals posted. One day fee: £10 for Seniors and £7 for Juniors (Exact fee would be appreciated) Two day fee: £18 for Seniors and £12 for Juniors Entries to be submitted via google forms. 2. For your Information

Event Format	 Target groups will consist of 3-4 archers (in-line with covid household regulations) The course will be 24 targets A time limit of 3 arrows in 3 minutes is allowed per target. All bosses are layered foam. Shooting pegs will be, Red, Blue, Yellow and White. 					
COVID	 Please respect social current distancing requirements within your target group and with other competitors and officials. Our recommendation is minimum of 1 metre. Each boss will have sanitising wipes and a bag for the disposal of wipes. We would encourage you to sanitise your hands after each end of shooting. We also recommend a 'quiver pack'' with your own personal PPE should you wish to take additional precautions, sanitiser spray, face covering, tissues, rubber gloves etc. 					
Awards	Medals will be awarded to highest placed archers shooting from the appropriate peg for their age group and bow classification. Medals will be awarded in all categories according to the number of entries. • 1 – 3 entries = 1 medal. • 4 – 5 entries = 2 medals. • 6 or more entries = 3 medals.					
Club Discretion Awards	Awards will be presented to Novice/Beginners shooting on a white peg. There will be an Under 12 'Cub' category.					
	Master	Men Women	50 +	50 -	4.2.5. An athlete may participate in a Master Class in tournaments when the competition takes place in the year of his 50th birthday and thereafter.

3. For Your Information

Junior Shooting Groups	Junior archers will be placed in the same target group as their senior family member if shooting. If a senior family member is not shooting, then, Junior members should be accompanied by a parent/family adult and the target group will also have an adult member of AGB present.			
Red Call	If emergency assistance is required in the field. The following procedure will apply. The archers call the target number followed by RED . When the call is heard by other archers, they will immediately stop shooting and repeat the call. Shooting will recommence on a whistle. No one will resume shooting until the restart is signalled.			
Dress	It is recommended that competitors wear clothing appropriate to the venue and weather conditions.			
Lost Arrows	When searching for lost arrows, please ensure that 1 archer always remains in front of the boss. If a shooting group arrives at the target, please do not delay shooting. Please record all lost arrows on your scorecard and we will make a note of them.			
Allergies	Please inform the Tournament Officer prior to the competition , tournamentofficer@loughcuanbowmen.org if you have any allergies which may affect you or other archers in the course of the competition			
Smoking	No smoking (including e-cigarettes and VAPE cigarettes) is permitted on the course.			
GDPR	In submitting your entry to the competition, the following information will be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors to aid the administration of the shoot for example, target lists and results will be published: First Name, Surname, bow style, shooting classification, Email, Club (and ID), University (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info. Information collected will be held to assist club records.			
Photography	As this is a WA arrowhead/UKRS mixed round, no photography is permitted on the course. Photographs may be taken by LCB (designated marshal) and may be used for the club website, social media, magazine and in publicity articles (e.g., AGB magazine). If parents/carers have any particular concern about their child/young person being photographed or filmed they should notify the organisers. Please note in line with the Photographing & Filming Children & Young People in Sport policy we would seek to obtain written permission from the subject and/or their parents/carers to publish images on the internet or in print.			
Car Parking	Parking will be available free on site, adjacent to the registration area. We would request under current COVID-!9 conditions that you park 2 metres apart where possible. (2 doors width).

We are operating under 'restricted shooting' guidelines and there will be some changes to our normal field procedures. While it might be different, we still want you to relax, have fun, enjoy the company (socially distanced of course) and have a good days shooting.



Thinking Ahead

- You will be sent details of your target group via email.
- Remember to bring your own food & drink.
- We recommend a quiver pack with hand sanitiser and additional PPE you feel you may need.



Arrival

- Please Park in the farmyard courtyard (see below) A club marshal(s) will be at hand to direct and guide you through arrival and registration.
- Where possible please allow 1 car width between cars if possible.
- This will allow you space to set up your equipment.

Please do not attend if:

1. You have any Covid-19 symptoms

First things first? Should I attend?

- 2. You are required to self isolate for reasons set out in government guidelines or regulations
- If you are a visitor or spectator unless supervising junior competitors.



Registration

- Go to the registration point.
- Please have your entry fee ready (exact fee please) and place it in the cash box.
- Collect your score card (X2)
- Proceed to the assembly point at Forthill woods. Follow the directional signs.
- At the assembly area remain with your target group and socially distanced from other target groups.



Shooting

- Archers will shoot as normal, respecting social distancing rules
- Archers will pull their own arrows, using foot or knee against the target for leverage
- Arrow holes must be marked
- Line cutters must be decided by group.
- Should you need to wipe the target face, wipes are provided at the rear of the boss. Please dispose in the waste bag.
- We recommend cleaning hands regularly as you shoot the course.



Course


- Please maintain social distance within your group
- Please maintain an appropriate distance between the group ahead and the group behind
- No "catching up" allowed
- Judges will be on the course to assist you if required.
- Please respect other archers in their desire to maintain social distancing



Finishing


- When you finish shooting, please make your way back to the farmyard.
- Complete your score cards and place in the marked box at registration.
- If claiming a record or arrowhead, please complete the paper slip which accompanied your score card.
- There is no medal ceremony, and scores will be sent by e-mail and medals posted.
- Archers must then pack up and leave the venue. Sorry if it sounds harsh.





Mount Stewart is located on the Portaferry Road. Travelling from Newtownards it is approximately 5 miles.

Enter mount Stewart through the main entrance on the Portaferry Road and proceed straight ahead. You should bring your AGB membership card to show to the attendant

Continue past the car parks on your right. You will come to a T junction, turn right, and follow the road.

You will come to a courtyard, keep right, and proceed straight ahead, past a house and outbuildings on your left.

Take the turning to the left and proceed through to the car park. Please observe the speed limits in the demesne.

On entering the car park, please follow the directions of the marshal.

If space allows, try to park 1 car width apart. This will allow you space to set up your equipment.

Once you have your equipment set up, register for the shoot and a marshal will direct you to the practice area/course.










Access to the course.
