Medals will be awarded to highest placed archers shooting both days, from the appropriate peg for their age group and bow classification. (See below)

Medals will be awarded in all categories according to the number of entries.

- 1 3 entries = Gold medal.
- 4 5 entries = Silver medal.
- 6 or more entries = Bronze medal.

- Senior: Men and Women
- 50+: Men and Women
- Men: –Under 21, Under 18, Under 16, Under 15, Under 15, Under 12
- Women: Under 21, Under 18, Under 16, Under 15, Under 15, Under 12

3. For Your Information

Juniors shooting as Seniors	Juniors over the age of 12 are welcome to shoot on an equal footing with senior Archers and compete for the senior medals but must enter and pay as seniors.
Junior Shooting Groups	Junior archers will be placed in the same target group as their senior family member if shooting. If a senior family member is not shooting, then, Junior members must be accompanied by a parent/family adult member/responsible designated adult and always remain the responsibility of their parent/guardian.
Special Requirements:	Archers with a disability, or other special requirement should contact the Tournament Organiser if there is any matter that they wish to raise.
Red Call	If emergency assistance is required in the field. The following procedure will apply. The archers call the target number followed by RED . When the call is heard by other archers, they will immediately stop shooting and repeat the call. Shooting will recommence on a whistle. No one will resume shooting until the restart is signalled.
Dress	It is recommended that competitors wear clothing appropriate to the venue and weather conditions. Dress should be in line with WA and AGB regulations. AGB are section 307 of the Rules of Shooting: The latest version of the Rules are available under Member Resources behind sign in on the AGB website
Lost Arrows	In accordance with World Archery rules, searches for lost arrows must not delay shooting groups. When searching for lost arrows, please ensure that 1 archer always remains in front of the boss. If a shooting group arrives at the target, please move on . Please record all lost arrows on your scorecard and record them on the lost arrow sheet upon completion of scoring.
Anti Doping	Archery GB has put a set of anti-doping rules in place that all athletes and athlete support personnel must abide by. The anti-doping rules for Archery GB are consistent with the World Anti-Doping Code (the Code), the core document that harmonises anti-doping policies, rules and regulations within sport globally.
Drug Testing	Archers competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drugs testing. Competitors approached for drug testing must comply as noncompliance will be treated as a positive result. Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (Under 18's) to be drug tested if approached.
Allergies	Please inform the club secretary prior to the competition, secretary@loughcuanbowmen.org if you have any allergies which may affect you or other archers during the competition.
Smoking	No smoking (including e-cigarettes and VAPE cigarettes) is permitted on the course.
GDPR	In submitting your entry to the competition, the following information will be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors to aid the administration of the shoot for example, target lists and results will be published: First






	Name, Surname, bow style, shooting classification, Email, Club (and ID), University (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info. Information collected will be held to assist ANI/club records.
Photography	As a club shoot photography is prohibited on the course; however we request that in line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy, those who wish to take photographs at this event register at registration on arrival. Please ensure if taking photographs you do not distract archers shooting. Please note in line with the Photographing & Filming Children & Young People in Sport policy you may be required to obtain written permission from the subject and/or their parents/carers to publish images on the internet or in print. Photographs may be taken by LCB (designated marshal) and may be used for the club website, social media, club newsletter and in publicity articles (e.g., AGB magazine). If parents/carers/children have any particular concern about their child/young person being photographed or filmed, please bring this to the attention of the registration team.

Where exactly is Clandeboye Estate?




Clandeboye Estate is approximately:

Once you have your equipment set up, make your way to registration.




Car Parking
