



Silver for Sophie at World Archery Field Championships



Congratulations to Sophie who won the silver medal at the World Archery Field Championships in Zagreb in August (Junior Barebow)

This is a terrific achievement as this was her first major competition and there were competitors from over 28 countries represented.

The competition took place in Zagreb's oldest public park, Maksimir Park. The first day of competition, was the unmarked round followed on day 2 by the marked round. At the end of the qualification rounds Sophie finished 4th, ensuring a semi-final play-off.

In the semi-final, Sophie had the difficult task of coming up against the number 1 seed, Jessica Nilsson from Sweden. However, Sophie was undaunted and remained her calm usual self, winning 41-27. Sophie would then face Italian Anna Carrasco in the shoot-off for Gold/silver.

The final was streamed on the internet by World Archery TV and meant an early start for many in Lough Cuan and I imagine an excited, nervous and proud Benton family watching at home. The final was a very tight affair and Sophie showed very little sign of nerves, taking an early lead. At the end of the set targets both archers finished with 42 points, which meant a one arrow shoot-off to decide the gold medal. Anna Carrasco scored five points and just denied Sophie the gold medal.







Thursday Evening on Your Mind



Clandeboyne Field Shoot

It was good to see so much of the LCB blue (and Andy's pink) out on the field at Clandeboyne. The weather was perfect and added to the day. There was a good turn out and the feedback from the visiting archers was very good. Thank you to the members for arriving early to help with set up and for staying on to help clear up and look for lost arrows. The help as usual is very much appreciated.

Shooting Indoors

Now that we are back indoors and with quite a few new members, it is a good opportunity just to highlight the guidelines for shooting indoors



Shooting cannot start until the 'range' has been set up. So if you can come early and help it is appreciated.



All equipment not being used when shooting should be kept to the spectator area.



The archer should remain behind the 'waiting line' while waiting to be called to the 'shooting line.'



When the archer hears the command 'to the line' they move forward to the shooting line to 'loose' their arrows. They will stand with one foot either side of the line. Arrows must only be placed on bows at the shooting line. While on the bow, arrows must always point towards the targets.



Having shot his/her arrows the archer will return behind the waiting line. The bow will be placed behind the waiting line when collecting arrows.



On the command, 'Clear to collect' the archer will retrieve their arrows from the target boss. The archer must always walk to the target boss



When retrieving arrows from the target boss the archer should stand to the side of the arrows to 'pull' them. While waiting to 'pull' arrows, never stand directly in line to the arrows.



If an arrow(s) goes behind the boss they will need to be retrieved and all arrows should be accounted for at the end of the evening.



Once arrows have been retrieved, place them in the quiver and return (walking) behind the waiting line, ready to shoot again.



'Captain, my Captain'

The field captain is in charge of the archery range and will call archers to the line and signal when it is clear to collect arrows. Their instructions should be listened to and followed at all times.

If the command **HOLD FAST** is called, everyone must stop shooting immediately. The bow should be brought down and the arrow returned to the quiver or the ground. Anyone on the range may, and indeed should, shout "FAST!" whenever they notice range safety being compromised. Shooting will only resume on the command of the field Captain.

S.T.A.R. sessions

As mentioned, the STAR Sessions will start again, around the 17th September, 7.00pm to 8.30pm in Ards Leisure Centre. While primarily aimed at Beginners and Intermediate archers anyone can ask to attend. The hall costs around £14.00 for the hour and a half (or it did last year) which will have to be covered by the participants.

Rather than inviting up to 4 archers on each session we intend to run sessions as workshops, so more participants will bring the individual cost down. Archers are invited to put their names down for sessions - they don't have to attend them all, although the benefit of attending all will accumulate, however, from our experience from last year, we will be asking for payment to cover the hall hire in advance. Coaches are invited to work alongside us should they wish (CPD points can be in offer from regularly working with a higher level Coach).

FITA Feather and Arrow awards will be run within the Club again. I have a few names and anyone who wasn't at the last session can join in as can any new archer if they join at a future date. This award scheme is intended for juniors and some adults (e.g. with disabilities) FITA suggest anyone can ask to do this.



Over the summer an enthusiastic group took part in the beginners course. These are always very popular and a great way for people to be introduced to archery and very often as a result, the club gains a number of new members.

The group slots into their next target once it is clear and continues as normal. When archer re-joins the group after equipment fixed, they forfeit all make up arrows to that time.
