"Wilderness has always been a common denominator for me, from when I roamed Montana's Bitterroot Mountains as a boy to my professional career to my present status as one of Montana's "Wilderness Statesmen". I have represented Montana for The Wilderness Society, worked as the first full time employee of the Montana Wilderness Association (now Wild Montana), taught wilderness field courses for the University of Montana and oversaw the Wilderness and Civilization Program at UM's Wilderness Institute. I operated a Wilderness backpacking guide service throughout Montana for 40 years and I have authored numerous magazine articles and books about Wilderness and roadless areas in Montana including "Montana Wildlands" and "Wild Montana".

I especially enjoy sharing wilderness stories and adventures with young people, the Next Generation."

"I formed my love of nature in my youth as a very active Eagle Scout. Moving from Ohio as a young man, I worked for the Forest Service, graduated from U of M and started my own outfitting business. I wanted my guests to feel the "hush of the land", to

learn about the flora and fauna, the geology and the history of the area they were riding through. I practiced "light on the land" techniques and went on to teach packing, horsemanship and wilderness ethics to thousands of people over 50 years, teaching winter classes in my home barn as well as contracting with Nine Mile Remount Station, USFS.

Although retired as an outfitter, at the age of 91 I am still teaching and advocating for wilderness use and understanding with the young people, the Next Generation."
