On the 1st of April 2024, the ARPA Team was officially formed. Hence, the planning process for the six different projects under the US EDA (U.S. Economic Development Administration) grant began.

Kosrae State Visit

From May 21st to 24th, the National Tourism Division and Kosrae Tourism Visitors Bureau organized a state visit to discuss the USEDA Grant for six tourism projects and events. The team, led by the Assistant Secretary/Project Manager, met with key Kosrae officials, including the Governor, Lt Governor, and other executives, to present the projects' objectives, timelines, and outcomes.

The team also held a half-day meeting with 22 stakeholders, including local businesses and state representatives, to address tourism challenges such as funding, infrastructure, and airline limitations. Stakeholders' concerns were acknowledged, and the team outlined how the projects would address these issues.

The Governor suggested holding an annual National Tourism Conference to better coordinate and market the nation as a destination. Additionally, the team visited the Yela Conservation Forest to learn about its ecosystem and the significance of the Ka tree.

Pohnpei State Visit

The National Tourism Division and Pohnpei Tourism hosted a two-day consultation meeting on June 20th and 21st at the Central Building complex, attended by 53 participants from various groups. The purpose was to discuss six upcoming USEDA Grant tourism projects and events.

The meeting was attended by 30 government, state, and local representatives. Activities included icebreakers and brainstorming sessions to identify suitable tourism markets for Pohnpei. The Key markets identified included historical sites, cultural heritage, community-based tourism, marine activities, food experiences, and eco-tourism. The challenges discussed included transportation, poor tourism services, and lack of awareness. Furthermore, the desired improvements focused on capacity building, financial support, and environmental beautification.

The second day involved 23 tourism stakeholders, private sector members, and women's groups. Participants discussed suitable tourism markets, identifying historical sites, culture, heritage, and eco-tourism as key areas. Other markets included community-based tourism, food, marine activities, and adventure.

Yap State Visit

On July 8th and 9th, the National Tourism Division and Yap Visitors Bureau organized a state visit to discuss the USEDA Grant for six tourism projects. The team, led by the Assistant Secretary/Project Manager, met with the Yap Head of State and key officials to present the projects' objectives, timelines, and expected outcomes. They addressed issues like tourism product development, airline challenges, and environmental concerns.

The team paid a courtesy visit to the Governors office in the morning and at the Yap State Legislature in the afternoon. Speaker emphasized the need for intellectual property laws to protect Micronesian culture and heritage, showing strong support for the projects.

On July 9th, a stakeholder meeting was held with 19 participants, including tourism stakeholders, business representatives, and officials. They discussed Yap's tourism markets, challenges, and desired improvements. Key concerns included funding, limited activities, cultural preservation, and infrastructure. Proposed improvements included expanding Yap Day activities, developing a cultural center, and increasing local business opportunities. The team acknowledged these issues and outlined how the projects would address them, noting that intellectual property laws would also be considered.

Chuuk State Visit

Due to a flight cancellation and ongoing Expo preparations, the planned state visit to Chuuk was altered. Meetings with stakeholders, the governor, and Chuuk State officials were canceled, but the team managed to meet with the Chuuk Visitors Bureau (CVB) and the Speaker of the State Legislature.

On July 10th, the team arrived in Weno, visited the CVB, and reviewed Expo preparations. On July 11th, a meeting was held with the CVB at the airport VIP room, focusing on upcoming projects, investment opportunities, and local issues such as leadership changes at United Airlines and community engagement. The CVB Manager also discussed potential partnerships and youth development.

Later, the team met with the Speaker of the House, who expressed full support for the six projects and events.




