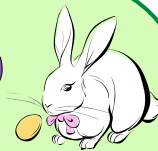

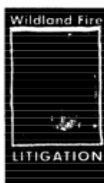
NASA was interviewing professionals to be sent to Mars. Only one could go — and couldn't return to Earth.

Law Library News

WHEN DID Google BECOME A VERB?

When I was cutting my teeth in legal research, the "world-wide-web" consisted of thousands of volumes of printed information, dusty and bound, neatly lining the shelves of a Law Library near me. The Law Library was indeed the place where all things wise and definitive in the legal world resided. . . . I believe it still is.

If that's the case, why are we getting ready to launch a series of classes for our patrons and qualified borrowers to teach how to get information, not from those volumes, but from the "otherworld" ... the internet? Because more and more courts are holding that due diligence mandates it. That's right; it's becoming a requirement of legal practice.

Why teach Google? In the decade since its launch, the word Google has been transformed from a noun to a verb – it is synonymous with searching on the Internet. "Hey Google this for me would ya?" But popularity isn't the reason to learn it in depth. Google has a number of integrated features that make it well suited to legal research; Google Voice, Wave, Translate, Docs and Hangout (video conferencing).

Over the course of the spring and summer, we will offer a class series to introduce novice Internet searchers to the diverse collection of information locatable through Google. Planned topics include:

- Learning the ins and outs of Google shortcuts to save time and money
- Using Google's advanced features for research to uncover valuable information on the Internet that might have otherwise been missed
- Using Google's free office applications to become more efficient in your practice and save money
- Learning and understanding the various Google tools and databases quickly and efficiently to access case law; find newspaper and magazine articles; set up Alerts; and locate information about expert witnesses, the opposition, jurors, existing and potential clients, missing witnesses, and more
- Searching for Federal Government-related resources using Google's Uncle Sam Search (or what used to be Uncle Sam Search).

Our Goal is to teach you, step-by-step, the "how" of using all of Google's features and offer tips, ethics alerts and various war stories from existing cases.

LIBERTY BELL AWARD 'Purpose & Guidelines'

*Government Code §68106 requires trial courts to provide notice to the public at least 60 days before closing any courtroom or closing or reducing hours of clerks' offices by conspicuous posting within its facilities and on its public website.

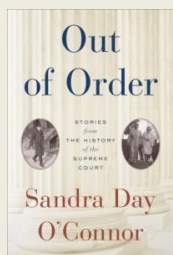

LOOKING FOR SCOTUS CONTROVERSY? CASE REVELATIONS? O'CONNOR BOOK STICKS TO FACTS OF COURT HISTORY

Readers hoping for juicy revelations about controversial Supreme Court cases or "tell all" insights won't find them in Sandra Day O'Connor's latest book.

But those looking for a "succinct, snappy account" of the Supreme Court's history should pick up the latest book by the retired justice, the New York Times reports. The Christian Science Monitor also has a review of the book, *Out of Order: Stories from the History of the Supreme Court*.

"This book is all about the facts, just the facts," the Christian Science Monitor says. "In the beginning, in 1789, the Supreme Court was smaller (six members), had no neoclassical building to call home, and, frankly, didn't have a whole lot to do. It heard no cases in its first four terms. Justices were appointed and often bolted as soon as something better came along."

O'Connor reports that early court records "were rife with textual errors, corrections and revisions," according to the Times account. Written opinions weren't required until 1834. Travel was a requirement, as justices spent as much as six months a year serving on trial courts. The roads were rough, and so were the accommodations; justices "were sometimes forced to share rooms with unsavory characters," O'Connor writes.

MSNBC published an excerpt. "So many aspects of the court were shaped and developed little by little, year by year, person by person," O'Connor writes. "The court was a daring, bold, but risky political experiment, and its beginnings were modest and uncertain."

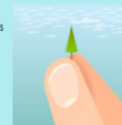

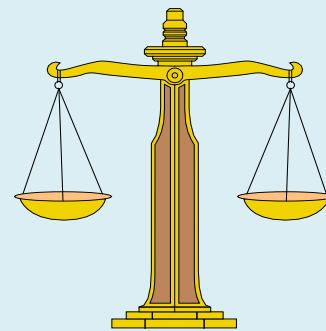
