With the holidays approaching we are reminded of the wonderful legal community we are a part of, and look forward to seeing you in the coming year.



**LOOK AT YOURSELF IN THE MIRROR:** Staring back at you is an attorney with a face hardened by a life battling in the trenches of the courtroom and negotiating high pressure deals.
