Aly, Our First Residential Strong Tower "Graduate"

Before I came to this program, I was homeless, an addict, jobless, alone...

When we first met Aly, she was obviously a victim of physical violence. As we learned more

of her life story, we knew she was one of the very women we had been called to provide the Strong Tower safe haven for. We had barely moved into the actual property and were working diligently with volunteer and financial partners to prepare for women to come.

God knew who we needed to be ready for first!

Even before we had located the house, we connected with Shari Johnston who wanted to share her Healing Through Art with the ST women. The very first area to be set up by volunteers was our art studio space. (Victims of trafficking and trauma often have memories and emotions that can only be expressed through creative means of art or movement.)

After Aly moved in, we learned she is an artist! She spent hours in the studio using her painting to connect with healing. Aly later created several pieces for KP to auction, just one way she was able to personally "give forward" to future ST women. One of our



treasured gifts is a painting she made specifically for Jay and me.



I feel not only safe, but loved for the first time in my life. I love the art studio, cooking lessons with the mentors and the horse farm, these are my favorites. The family dinners are something I've never experienced. I love it here! I'm healing and growing and I'm safe!



A Place to Call Home

We plan on the Strong Tower woman residing at the house for two years, so she has time to heal and create a path forward. She needs time to decide she's ready to do the hard work of healing and learning life skills you and I often take for granted.

When she was ready, Aly committed herself to doing everything she could to take back her life and future, including working, and saving her money toward her own financial goals. She

became a Jesus follower, starting a life of spiritual healing. After only nine months, she was ready to live independently. She's living clean, working, has her own apartment and car, and is continuing to heal.

Giving Forward

One of our goals is for the ST woman to know she has a home and a family to return to. Our hope is that she will encourage and challenge current women as they do the hard work of healing and making positive choices. Aly is doing just that! Here's part of a text conversation she recently had with a current ST woman...

Before I came to this program, I was homeless, an addict, jobless, alone. I'm here to tell you the support and love you guys receive will change your life. Put in the work and you'll see! Just don't be scared to take charge of your beautiful future! You are loved! I'm here! You're definitely not alone anymore.

A New Legacy

We know not every woman coming to ST will decide to stay and participate in the program. Often, victims of trafficking and trauma will need several attempts before they are truly ready to break the cycle. It takes tremendous courage to trust and accept love when they've never experienced it before.

Aly's personal courage has helped make a way for others to find the hope and help they need to create their path forward.

We are so proud of you, Aly, and we celebrate you!

Celebrating Life-Change Among Current Residents & Nonresidential Mentees

Darcey has been able to remain in contact with most of the women who have been involved in the ST program over the last year, plus those Darcey has mentored the last 10 years prior to KP purchasing the Strong Tower home.

Several have finished their GED program, are now married, and mothers themselves. One is

currently working on her BA at Cedarville University.

"S" (resident) will begin driving lessons in preparation for getting her driver's license. She also just passed her entrance exams and will begin her post-high school education at COTC.

"C" (resident) was freed from a physical issue she had suffered for years due to trafficking.

"A" (former resident) welcomed her second daughter into this world and is a loving mom.



The women we come alongside are between the ages of 18-25 and have aged out of Ohio's foster care system and/or victims of human trafficking.
