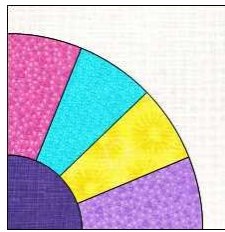
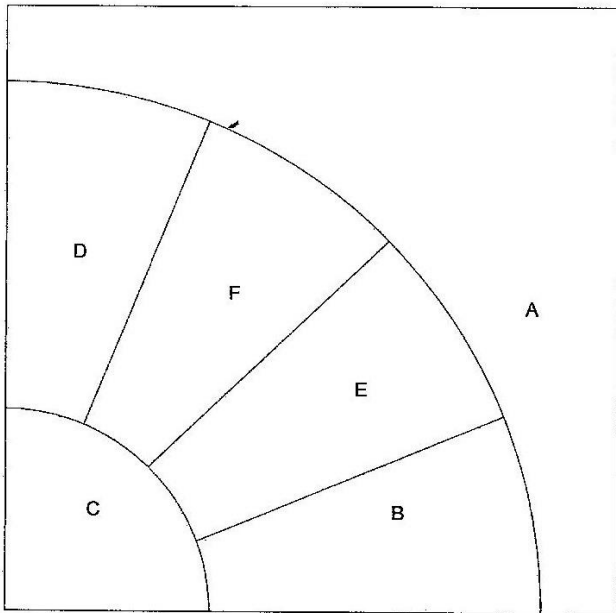


Hearts & Hands 2021 Nametag Holder

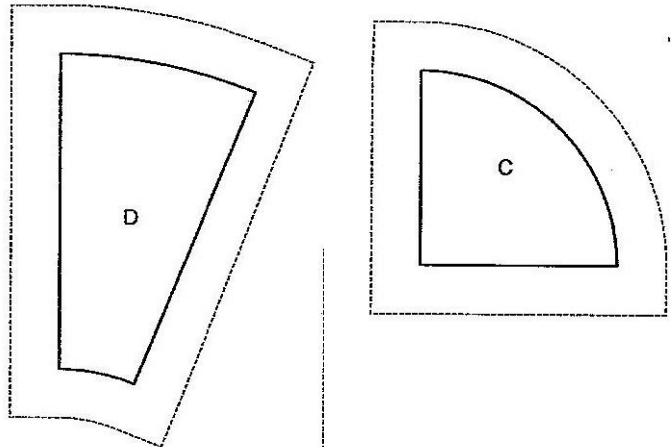


Every 2 years when we choose a new Quilt Show theme, we also make new Nametag Holders that are related to the current Raffle Quilt. This year the choice was between a Fan Block and a tiny Lemoyne Star. The fan block was chosen for ease of construction. The fan will be applied to a background color of your choice. The picture above reflects the colors in the Raffle Quilt, but what you choose is up to you. Following are 2 sets of instructions for making the Nametag Holder – either Raw Edge or Turned Edge (Needle Turn or Machine) Applique’.

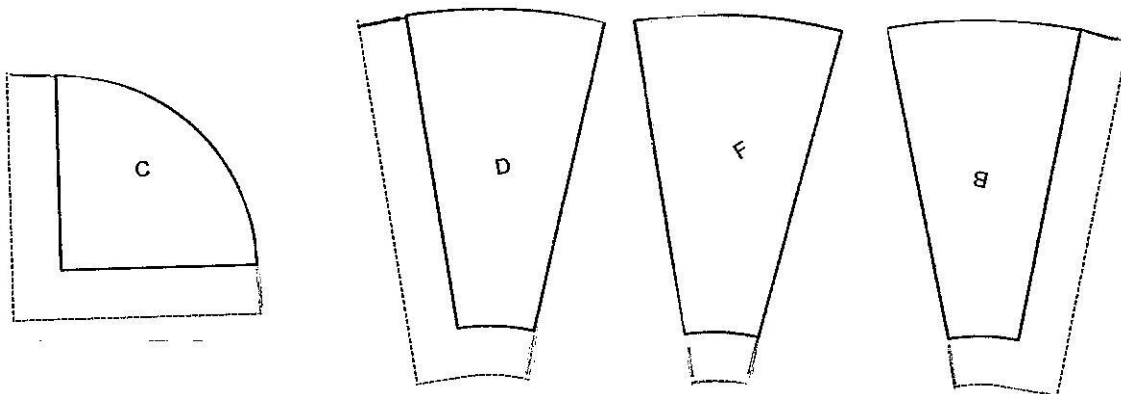
For both sets of instructions, you need to start with 2 - 3 ½” squares of your background fabric and a 3” x 1 ¼” rectangle for the hanging loop.



For Turned Edge Applique – cut 4 blades from the template shown below and one center quarter circle. Sew the blades together before appliqueing to the background



For Raw Edge Applique – cut using the templates shown below. Cut 1 each of D,B, and C. Cut 2 each of F. The seam allowances will be sew into the seams of the block. Use a fusible such as Wonder Under to adhere your fan to your background and sew using a decorative stitch or zig-zag..



Make the hanging loop by turning each long edge under ¼” and stitching. Hold the hanging loop in half and position it so that it is centered on the bottom or top of your fan block where you will attach your nameplate.

Place your appliqued fan right sides together with your second background square and stitch a ¼” seam around the outside edge. Leave an opening to turn right side out. Turn it and stitch the opening closed.
