



Cloth bin/basket materials

All Fabrics will show, as will all Stitches

4 fabric strips at 2 ½ X 42"-44"

4 batting strips at 2" X 42"-44"

Batting 7" round (we will cut this to fit)

½ fat quarter

Coordinating thread – *ALL stitches will show*

Denim needle similar to 90/14

Sewing machine with zigzag stitch

Iron and ironing board (we will share these in class)

Normal sewing notions (scissors, pins etc)

Optional, but helpful, clips

I will have plenty of clips and 90/14 needles for anyone that needs them

Alternate Options:

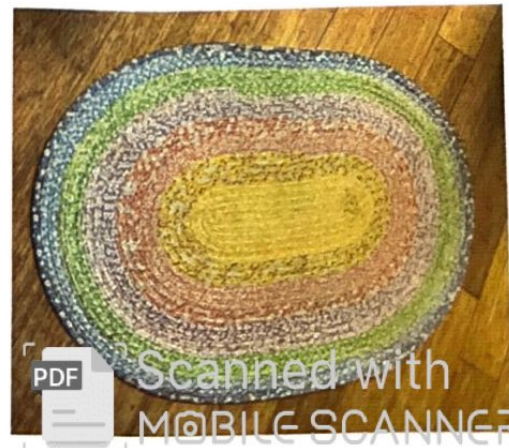
Fabric - you can use any left-over binding, just ensure its all the same width (2 ¼, 2, etc), it can be pieced together as needed. As an alternate you can bring 8 strips of 2 ½ or 2 ¼ or 2 X 21"-24"

For a slightly taller bin/basket you can add more strips of fabric/batting

Batting strips can be pieced and do not need to be sewn together, or if you have previously purchased batting that is pre-cut to 2" or 2 ½".

Fat quarter – could be any coordinating fabric, we will cut 2 6" circles and 2 6"X3" strips (left over binding will work for this)

This method is also used to make a jelly roll rug, you will need a full jelly roll (40 strips) and batting for all strips.



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
