Project Name: Madera County Evacuation Route Identification, Assessment, and Fuels Treatment Project

Please be advised that in partnership with Madera County, the Eastern Madera County Fire Safe Council will be performing hazard fuels reduction work along roads 621, 420, and 225 in the county right-of-way. This fuels reduction project was chosen in consult with CAL FIRE as a high priority project in order to provide safer evacuation routes and to remove downed storm debris. Slash will be chipped and broadcast.

Roadside work will commence in early July. Residents and commuters using these roads can expect possible delays during construction and intermittent lane blockage. Please drive safely. We appreciate your fullest cooperation to help make the project a safe one.

Roads will remain open during the project execution, however, please be mindful of the following:

1. Please do not park along the roadside during the work period.
2. Please be alert when driving, walking, or biking in any area receiving treatment and watch for road signage.
3. For the safety of children, crew, and pets, please keep them away from the construction zone and assure pets are secured in their yards.
4. No pedestrians will be allowed in the work zone.
5. Please be courteous to the crew and direct all inquiries to the site foreman.
