# **CSRC Volunteering Guidelines**

#### What do I do as a volunteer?

- Typically we have roles assigned before going to events. We arrive around an hour before the events and make sure you are comfortable with your role. As people start to arrive, you will facilitate the area you were assigned and interact with any newcomers to make their experience in Chicago more welcoming.
