Jacob Lawrence's "Legend of John Brown" is a limited edition twenty-two serigraph print series by the world famous African American artist, Jacob Lawrence. The paintings with corresponding narrative are historically accurate and depicted in Lawrence's unique artistic style. Jim's talk will look at each print and discuss the artistic elements of each print and then the backstory of the event(s) in John Brown's life, which is depicted in the print.

Jim is a retired Internal Medicine physician. He trained as a docent at the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts after retirement and was very active giving talks and leading group tours until the COVID 19 pandemic halted activities at the museum. In addition to docent activities, he is a passionate photographer.
