This Month's Program

The Kalamazoo Civil War Roundtable is proud to announce that Cameron Brown will present a program on the American Civil War song "Battle Hymn of the Republic". The program will be held Friday, January 19th. The meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. with the usual social period. The program will begin at 7:30 pm. The meeting will be held at the Westwood United Methodist Church, 538 Nichols Road, Kalamazoo, MI.

Born in Washington, D.C., and raised in Northern Virginia, Cameron S. Brown is the sixth generation of his family to reside in southwest Michigan. Prior to serving in both the Michigan Senate and Michigan House of Representatives, Cameron was employed as Marketing Vice President for a southwest Michigan healthcare products manufacturer. He has an MPA from Western Michigan University, and a BA in History from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. He also attended the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia. Among Cameron's most formative educational experiences was living in West Africa as a child and later attending T.C. Williams High School in Alexandria, Virginia the eventful year depicted in the Walt Disney movie, Remember the Titans. Cameron was vice president of the senior class.

Since being term-limited from the Michigan Senate in 2010, Cameron has established his own consulting business serving both private and public sectors. Cameron is a frequent keynote speaker on a range of topics drawn from the treasure trove of American history, most notably Abraham Lincoln. He has taught political science at Kalamazoo Valley Community College and Michigan History at Glen Oaks Community College. He currently is a monthly guest columnist with Michigan Gannett newspapers.

The former lawmaker is president of the Kalamazoo Abraham Lincoln Institute, a Michigan nonprofit corporation spearheading efforts to promote Kalamazoo's unique Lincoln legacy. Having more than a passing interest in Abraham Lincoln, Cameron is related to Joseph Sessford, ticket taker at Ford's Theatre the night President Lincoln was assassinated.

Cameron is married to Helen Lukan. The couple resides in Kalamazoo. Their retreat is the family farmhouse in Fawn River Township, St. Joseph County, Michigan built by Cameron's great-great grandparents. You can follow Cameron at HistoryFrontiers.blog.
