


Pillar I: Worship

Below are some ways to become and continue to become actively involved in the church in order to grow in your faith.

 - Ask your parish priest to start a chapter Bible study

Pillar II: Service



Part 1: Building Strong Walls Out of the Foundations We Have

As a board member, you play a crucial role in upholding and advancing the mission of our organization. This guide will help you understand our mission, core values, and the expectations for your role.

Know and Understand Our Mission

As board members, it is essential to know and understand our mission statement and the core pillars that support our foundation.

Who are we? We are a youth organization rooted in the traditions of the Armenian Apostolic Church.

What do we do? We offer opportunities for members to engage in Worship, Service, Education, and Fellowship.

How do we do it? Our programs and activities are designed to align with our church's doctrines and traditions.


- Gap Identification: A key area of focus is ensuring that all members are aware of and adhere to these pillars. This is crucial for maintaining alignment with our mission and enhancing the effectiveness of our programs.
- Program Goals: Every activity or program should have a clear goal. It's important
 to understand not only how a program will be executed but also why it's being
 undertaken and how it aligns with our mission and pillars.

Encouraging Involvement:

- Regular members should be motivated to contribute actively. Provide them with opportunities to engage in meaningful ways that align with our mission.
- Address Participation Gaps
 - Identify why members might not be participating as expected and work on strategies to increase their engagement.

Guide to Strategic Planning Using Logic Models & Setting SMARTER goals

What is a Logic Model? A logic model is a visual representation that links resources, activities, and outcomes to help plan and evaluate programs. It shows how and why a desired change is expected to occur, making it easier to manage and assess the effectiveness of your initiatives.



Inputs/Resources There are lots of resources available within the Armenian Church. Here are some examples

- Facilities: utilize the church grounds for events and such
- Priests: engage with clergy for spiritual guidance and involvement
- Parents: utilize their professional expertise and support
- Central Council
- Funds/ finances
- Social media pages
- Yourselves: each member has a different talent that can be incorporated into the organization

Activities These connect inputs with outputs. Ensure that every activity aligns with the overarching goals and outcomes. Avoid engaging in activities that do not support your strategic objectives. These should always incorporate the four pillars of ACYO.

Outputs These are the immediate results from activities. Do not confuse this with outcomes which are long term impacts.

Impact (or effects) These are the long term goals of your organization. What do you see in 10 years? 5 years? 3 years?

Tips and tricks:

- Work backwards through the logic model. Start with your impact and work your way back to resources.
- Remember that the resources of our communities are infinite. The hardest part about a resource is figuring out how to bring it in
- Easiest way to come up with an impact is to look for gaps that you see today. Start with the desired outcomes and identify current gaps.
- Be very specific. The more specific your goals, the easier it is to create targeted activities and outputs.
- Include members when planning. They are your future too. If they don't share the same vision as you, your goals won't be achieved.
- If you haven't seen any progress, that doesn't mean you scrap your plan. Figure out why it isn't working and make adjustments as necessary.
- Do everything with a purpose, otherwise you will be wasting time, energy and resources
- Constantly refer back to the logic model when planning any events or making any decisions

Having a vision/dream is vital in the continuation of our ACYO. Without a clear target, you're unlikely to achieve meaningful results. Let's work together to build a strong, purposeful organization that honors our heritage and fulfills our mission.

What are SMARTER goals? Smarter goals are a criteria for goal setting. They provide a more comprehensive framework to ensure goals are well-defined, actionable, and adaptable.

Specific: Goals should be clear and precise, leaving no room for ambiguity. They should answer the questions: What do we want to accomplish? Why is this goal important? Who is involved? Where will this happen? What resources or constraints are involved?

Measureable: Goals need criteria to measure progress and success. You should be able to quantify the outcome or use indicators to track progress.

Achievable: Goals should be realistic and attainable within your resources and constraints. Consider what is feasible given current circumstances.

Relevant: Goals must align with broader organizational objectives and be pertinent to the current needs and priorities of the organization.

Timebound: Goals should have a specific timeframe for completion. This includes deadlines and key milestones to track progress.

Evaluated: Regularly assess and review goals to ensure they remain relevant and achievable. Adjust goals and strategies based on performance and changing conditions.

Reward/Record: Recognize and reward achievements to maintain motivation and engagement. Record successes and failures to keep track of what works and doesn't.

Part 2: Boosting Member Engagement

Maintaining member engagement has been a constant struggle across ACYO for generations. However, by understanding and connecting with our members on a deeper level, we can create lasting impacts and foster a strong, devoted community.

Remember that our mission is to integrate our members into the life of the church. Retention isn't in reference to keeping numbers high or participation active, BUT rather that members are showing up to A church, even if it isn't their home parish. We want to create a loyalty and devotion to the Armenian Apostolic Church that will last a lifetime.

To gain new members, do the research. Identify and highlight households with children in your community. Reach out to them through cold calls and mail and make your presence known.
