The Prime Minister got to work immediately bringing temporary relief to those who suffered loss or damage, and he offered the assurance that everything would be done to restore lives and livelihoods. In the coming weeks and months, affected persons were given brand new appliances and furniture to replace those damaged, homes were repaired where possible or families relocated to new homes where necessary. Comrade Ralph met with grieving families, pledged the assistance of the government with funeral expenses, doing everything to provide some comfort during the difficult times. All this while members of the opposition could be heard responding "that is not my job" when asked to collect names of those affected in specific constituencies or the leader of the opposition suggesting that affected families be allowed to import new appliances at concessionary rates.
