Life In the Lake

After several years, we were all happy to see a loon chick on the lake and enjoyed watching it mature! There is interest in having a loon specialist speak at one of our get togethers next summer.

Fortunately there were no worrisome reports of invasive weeds seen in the lake or on any boats screened at the public landing. There was a small area of purple loosestrife removed, and there is a small area of common reed being monitored, slightly in from the lakeside. We are most appreciative of everyone who inspects their area of

the lake around their docks and refers any questions to the Weed Watchers.




Loon and Chick

As you know the Lake Host Program, sponsored by the NH Lakes Association, is our major preventive program aimed at preserving the water quality of the lake.

We also submit periodic water tests. Mike Poole reports that, “The water clarity was much better this year compared to last summer,” because of all the rain last year. “Our last check in August the clarity was at 5.5 meters which is the average it has been in the past. We checked 5 locations around the lake to see what the bacteria (E.coli) levels are and they all came back well under the state average.”

Our 2018 budget was just under \$7000, and more than 90% of this is to cover our share of expenses for the Lake Host Program.

We are sad to share the news that Ann Caswell died August 31, 2018 after several years of failing health. We will miss her. Brad and her family held a celebration of her life in late October.

The Lake Association, with some private donations, has had a plaque made to honor the memory of Kelly Fitzpatrick, who died in 2016. Kelly loved these lakes and mountains and he did tremendous work to protect this area. With help from Tom Cochrane, this plaque will be placed at the public landing in the spring.

This past summer we had a plaque made to honor Ann Soloway and the 70th anniversary of Camp Walt Whitman. This plaque is on a bench at the camp.

Many of you knew Charley Muntz who died this past winter. Charley was very instrumental in establishing the Lake Hosts programs on Lakes Tarleton and Armington. We will be contributing to a memorial fund being planned by the Lake Tarleton Association.

Dam Update

This summer the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services replaced the Lake Armington Dam. The crew removed the old concrete dam and built a new dam while

maintaining the lake level behind a temporary (coffer) dam. The coffer dam, access roadway and staging area will be removed and the area restored this fall. The work was accomplished without affecting the lake level or disrupting life on the lake this summer. They did a professional job and should be done on schedule before the winter.

We will be sending a letter to the State complimenting them on the work once they are completely done. The new concrete dam should last many years and we are thankful that the project has proceeded smoothly.
