Nahar Torah – Niddah Series #6 Ain Pesichas Ha'kever B'lo Dam

Shalom everyone! In the last shiur we completed our understanding of what it means to be a niddah d'orysa, as well as an in depth analysis of what a hargasha is. We mentioned the term: pesichas ha'kever b'lo dam, which practically means that, in the eyes of halacha, it is impossible to have the uterus open without blood coming out. The question then becomes: 1. How to we practically define this term? 2. Is this applicable if an external source opens the uterus - like a medical procedure/doctor?

→ Defining *Pesichas Hakever*: The *Nodeh Yehuda* suggests that any time there is *pesichas ha'kever*, no matter from where – doctor or internal – she is *temea d'orysa*. The *Pitchay Teshuva*, and most *Poskim*, reject the *Nodeh B'yehuda*.

Finally, we get to the *psakim* of the *Mechaber & Rama*:

<u>Mecahber¹-</u> ain pesichas ha'kever b'lo dam

Rama- ain pesichas ha'kever b'lo dam

Halacha L'maysa:

 \rightarrow <u>Ashkenazim:</u> Paskin like the Nodeh B'yehuda that even an external source can cause פתיחת הקבר

→ <u>Sefardim:</u> Rav Ovadya holds like the Chazon Ish that it is only an internal cause which can lead to פתיחת הקבר

However, for each medical procedure one should ask a שאלה.

So the main point we need to take out is that in order to answer a question about a medical procedure, we need to understand where it is taking place and how wide the instrument being inserted is!

Lastly, the Poskim debate about the size of *pesichas ha'kever* which is *metame*. *Rav Moshe*: ³/₄ inch = 19mm (US penny) and more whereas *Rav Eliyahu*: 3mm.
