
Shalom u'vracha everyone! We are excitingly starting our 3<sup>rd</sup> topic within hilchos niddah – harchakos! This topic is going to be much longer than vestos and kesamim, and it will also be much more practical and easier to understand – its going to be a great limud!

"Harchakos" means distancing; namely, since one can be mityached – be alone – with their wife who is niddah, Chazal added extra restrictions – harchakos – to ensure that the couple doesn't become intimate. Perhaps later in this series we can deal with hilchos yichud, as it is also a fascinating topic.

It is important to note some "GJK" – general Jewish knowledge" – about *hachakos*: First, *harchakos* are *issurei d'rabanan*, although we learn from the words "לא תקרבל" that one cannot hug, kiss or even converse in idle chatter with their *niddah* wife. The *Rambam* holds that hugging, kissing and even touching a *niddah* with your pinky is *assur d'orysa* from the *pasuk*: 'לא תקרבו לגלות ערוה'. Nonetheless, *M'd'orysa*, the only *issur* is sleeping together.

Furthermore: all the *harchakos* apply whether the woman is in her *niddah* days or *zayin nekiyim* – ז' בקיים – this point is extremely crucial to understand!

The *harchakos* can be broken up into two types of categories:



These two reasons form a *basis* – meaning, something can be *assur* because of one of the reasons, or both.
