



Shalom! Today we are going deal with the second category of *harchakos*, the *harchakos* of passing items from one spouse to another. These *harchakos* can be broken up into 3 categories as well:



Below are 3 cases:

Passing A Long Object	<i>Assur</i>	שמא יגע בה	רבינו ירוחם, ש"ך & seemingly the רמ"א	
Throwing An Object To One Another	<i>Assur</i>	1. קירבה 2. שמא יגע בה	1. רמ"א (על סמך הרשב"א) 2. רב משה	1. Throw the object directly up, and the spouse catches it on the way down – פתחי תשובה 2. If very far apart such that they won't touch, can throw directly at her (since no possibility of touching) – רב משה 3. Completely <i>muttar</i> to throw since <i>Mechaber</i> doesn't bring it, but still best to do like <i>heter 1</i> and throw it up – רב עובדיה
Placing A Blanket On The Wife	<i>Assur</i>	It is like throwing + קירבה	באר משה	She can take his blanket and cover herself
Playing Ping-Pong	<i>Assur</i>	קירבה	<i>Rav Yaakov Kamenstky & Rav Moshe.</i> *Note: <i>Rav Neventzal paskins</i> playing ping-pong is <i>assur</i> because it is both קירבה and like throwing.	The באר משה is <i>mattir</i> based on the fact that it is part of the rules to make sure it hits the table – therefore not like passing; says that the game is inherently not "lightheartedness." We do not <i>paskin</i> like this <i>l'maysa</i> .
