

## **We have to have an inclusive space for all children**

Ask the school to explain how their policies create an inclusive space for:

- children who may be same-sex attracted but are being told that it is transphobic or unkind to only want to have same-sex (not same-gender) relationships
- children who do not conform to sex stereotypes, without suggesting to them that this might mean their body does not fit their personality
- girls who have been sexually abused or assaulted and need single sex spaces in some circumstances, bearing in mind that most children who have been abused do not disclose at the time and therefore will not be known to the school
- children who, for religious reasons, need single sex spaces in some circumstances.
- children who, for reasons of privacy, safety and dignity, need single sex spaces in some circumstances
- children who hold the protected belief that humans can't change sex
