

## **The Baptism Rite**

Do you wish to be baptised?

**I do.**

Are you ready with your own mouth and from your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

**I do.**

The celebrant addresses the whole congregation

Faith is the gift of God to his people.

In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those  
whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome Tyler and uphold him in his life in Christ?

**With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

**I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

**I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

**I repent of them.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

**I turn to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

**I come to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

**I submit to Christ.**

*The celebrant makes the sign of the cross*

Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of the cross.

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

**Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ**

**against sin, the world and the devil,**

**and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,

restore in you the image of his glory,

and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

**Amen.**

### **The Prayer over the Water**

***V:*** Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
***R:*** **who keeps his promise for ever.**  
***V:*** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
***R:*** **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

### **The Profession of Faith**

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with Tyler the faith of the Church.
