We have reached out to Greater Cincinnati Water Works to bring presenters to our March members meeting who are experts in the field of water safety and quality, especially regarding PFAs (forever chemicals), microplastics and lead

pipe remediation. Anyone who sources their water from the Cincinnati Water Works should find this meeting to be interesting and informative because it affects our families' health and our day-to-day lives.

Alex Mendlein is a chemist specializing in organic analyses, including PFAs, for GCWW. With over seven years' experience in the water industry, she applies advanced analytical methods to assess drinking water safety and regulatory compliance. She has led major projects, including GCWW's lead pipe loop major research and is establishing expertise in microplastics to support research into contaminants of emerging concern.

Dawn Webb is a Supervising Management Analyst in the Lead Program Communications Team. With 25+ years of specialized experience in water treatment and lead in drinking water, Dawn Webb has become a respected authority in public water quality management. Formerly, Dawn was the Metals Laboratory Manager at GCWW, where she directed compliance efforts with the Lead and Copper Rule—overseeing sample collection, data analysis, EPA reporting, and customer outreach.

Currently, Dawn partners in communications for the Lead Line Replacement Program, collaborating with communities to support safer drinking water. Her role also spans water quality initiatives such as unidirectional flushing and active involvement in Water Research Foundation projects. Dawn has shared her expertise locally and nationally on lead -filter distribution, service line replacement, and laboratory best practices—advancing awareness and innovation in water safety across the industry.

We're very pleased to provide our members with such industry expertise at the meeting and we hope you will come prepared with your questions and concerns regarding such an important subject as our water quality and safety. There will be an article in our March issue that reviews ways to help avoid microplastic in our environment.
