THE MONFORT HEIGHTS LIBRARY TURNS 50 IN MARCH!



The West Fork Branch was known as the branch between two cornfields, when it was built on part of the farm belonging to Mrs. Rosie Beyer of Green Township, who frequented the branch until her death at age 106. It served as a rural library for the northwestern part of the county. Ground for the building was broken in November, 1969. The West Fork Branch opened on March 1, 1971, and has enjoyed many years of community growth. The building has the capacity to hold 60,000 books and other items. It was renamed the Monfort Heights Branch Li-

brary in January 2001 to better reflect the community it serves.

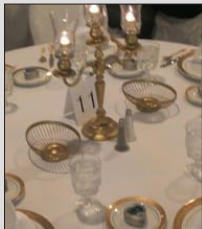
