Char's Tips




☆

TIP: SECONDARY PATTERNS PREVIEW. When identical quilt blocks are sewn together without sashing strips between them, a ★ secondary pattern forms where four ★ blocks meet. Use one block to preview the secondary pattern. Lay the

★ block facedown on a table and fold the ☆ four corners into the

center of the block. The smaller block formed where the four corners match is the secondary design you will see when the blocks are stitched together.

TIP: WHERE IS IT? The fastest and easiest way to find a missing sewing tool is to buy a replacement. Isn't that how many of us have duplicates or more of various tools?



Treasurer's additional comments for the August 2025 newsletter.

As approved by the SSQ board, the Wells Fargo (WF) Certificate of Deposit in the amount of \$10,887.94 was closed and moved to Alpine Bank. A new Certificate of Deposit was opened for \$5,000 and the remaining balance was used to open the new SSQ checking account. We have been issued two debit cards for this new account at Alpine issued to the Treasurer and President. If you need to make an online purchase for your committee, please contact either Loretta or Shari. We are hoping to use debit cards more than checks to keep the writing of checks to a minimum. We understand this doesn't always work and really appreciate your efforts.

Please accept my apologies for an error of communication regarding donations to the Arts of Mesa County by using the new Alpine debit cards. This only applies to personal debit cards and not business account debit cards.

We will continue to use the WF account through September. If you are issued a reimbursement check in September, please deposit or cash as soon as possible. Thank you.
