## Tips By Char



**TIP: DESIGN WALL?** If you need a small design wall, use the edge of your ironing board. Pin a block or blocks to the edge. This works if you have sewn a test block (You all do this, don't you?) or two and want to refer to color placement or mirror images. You might use the ironing board edge to pin an entire row to check for color placement or the placement of different block patterns. Remember to place your ironing board where you can see it when you sew. Just saying.

TIP: CHANGING YOUR MACHINE NEEDLES. We all know to change our sewing machine needles after 8 hours of sewing. Earlier if you hear that chunking sound. To remember, set your alarm on your phone. Or use a scrap of fabric and 8 pins. Remove a pin each hour sewn. All 8 pins removed, change the needle. Your machine needles will thank you if you don't sew over pins while piecing or quilting. Your machine will be happier as well.






#### **Stars Abound**
