General Meeting Minutes - The April meeting minutes were unanimously approved with no additions or changes.

Treasurer's Report - Loretta Bogaard - Loretta filed our tax report with the IRS. Details about this month's treasurer's report are published in the newsletter. Contact Loretta if you have questions.

Vice President's Report - Stacy Johnson - Stacy will chair the search committee for the SSQ 2026 Executive Board and Chairpersons. Contact her if you are willing to serve. There will be several openings, including President, Vice President, and Secretary. She has two tickets left to the RMQM. Stacy manages scholarships for SSQ workshops and membership dues, contact her to apply.

Room changes due to Owl's Nest closing - We have secured rooms at First Presbyterian for our June and July workshops. Sew Healing Expo (SHE) - We were invited to participate in this event coming to the GJ convention center June 18-21. The executive board declined the invitation when we were asked to display 50 quilts at a cost of \$20 per entry. Participating in the event also seemed like a conflict of interest for our M2M quilt show.

New Quilt Rack Purchase - The planning committee for the 2026 quilt show met last month and then submitted a detailed proposal to the Board, requesting we purchase new quilt racks for the show and other events. The motion to purchase passed, by majority vote, to spend about \$18K on new racks. A few advantages to new racks are: reduced tripping hazard for people viewing quilts; easier assembly; less maintenance since they are new. The old racks will be sold.

Membership Report- Barbara Bond - She will have knee surgery tomorrow and plans to be back for the June meeting. She has volunteers to help. Today we had 75 people present including two guests.

Block of the Every Other Month-Jewell Buck - Two colorways of the block were shown and the pattern for Clue #3 will be emailed to the membership soon.

SSQ Social Media Update – Karen Murray Boston - The spotlight today was on the membership page of our website. There is a new section and link called Your Library. It goes to a spreadsheet inventory of our quilt books and patterns. Big thanks to Karol Sacca for organizing the spreadsheet and Big thanks to Karen for adding it to the website! Karen recently purchased additional web domain names to help promote the Mesas to Monuments Quilt Show. She is the chairperson for the 2028 show.

Hospital Displays: Beverly O'Neil - Sign-ups generally start in November 2025 for 2026. However, you can sign up early by contacting her.

Programs and Workshops: Bonnie Huisjen - In June we welcome national teacher, Scott Flanagan. On the 11th he presents "My Quilting Journey" after the general meeting. His June 12th workshop is "Tuscan Vintage Quilt" and seats available. He will sell his patterns both days. Both events are at First Presbyterian. The October 8th program will be a sew-in working on the community affairs quilts, held at First Presbyterian. All are welcome.

Quilt Show: Janet Wheeler - Gearing up for the 2026 Quilt show, team leaders meet the third Wednesday every month at the Central Library. Entry prices will increase to \$10 per person. While volunteers still get in free, they can make a donation. We need large and small quilts for the auction. All quilts in the show, will need a four-inch sleeve to hang on the new racks.

Tips By Char



TIP: COLORS. Complementary colors—opposites on the color wheel—can fight for attention. (I can hear some of you say that's what is wrong with the colorway of the quilt I am working on or I saw in a magazine or was a community quilt donated recently.) Once you add grayed and muted tones to those colors, they become easy on the eyes and create a subtle, sophisticated palette.

TIP: THREAD. Thread is used for structure, that is, forming the fabric. Thread is used for embellishment. Thread is used for texture. One form of embellishment is couching which if you think about is using thread, yarn, cording to create a new thread colorway. Couching can also create new fabric. For instance, use a black fabric and couch new threads, side by side, until the entire base is covered. Then create a finished project such as a small purse. The back of the created fabric is the lining of the purse. Wonderfil Specialty Thread has some great decorative threads for your artistic creations. www.shopwonderfil.com
