

Step #6: Combine the units from step five and step one to make the following blocks. These will measure $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Press toward the large triangle corners.


Make 4: A



Make 4: B



Make 4: C



Arrange squares to match quilt center diagram and piece together. Sew sets of two (B and C) to sew onto opposite sides of the center 24 ½" square. Sew two rows of four (B and C with A's on each end for corners) to go on opposite sides of the center row, these will measure 48 ½" long. (see quilt top diagram)

Cutting Instructions for the border:

From the Medium Light, cut:

4 squares, 3 ½" x 3 ½"

From the Border Fabric, cut:


8 rectangles, 3 1/2" x 21 1/2"

4 squares, 3 7/8 " x 3 7/8", bisect each corner to corner for 8 triangles.


7 strips, 2 ½" x width of fabric for binding.

Piece the border triangles to the leftover pieced triangle units from step five and press toward the

triangles. These squares will measure 3 ½" x 3 ½". Piece the border rectangles to these squares and press toward the rectangle. Piece units to make the four border sides with the triangle points in the center.





Piece the quilt center as diagramed on the next page and press. Piece the borders to two sides of the quilt top and press toward the border. Piece the medium light squares to both ends of the other two border sections and press toward the border fabric. Piece to the last two sides of the quilt top and press toward the border.



Layer with batting and backing and quilt as desired. Bind with the 2 ½" strips.

*If you want to make a rectangular quit instead of a square one, use your leftovers to make a "piano key" border as shown in the video. I also added another border to the top and bottom of the quilt top to finish it off. Size these to suit your finished size preferences.
