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Methodology

Data collected were analysed using arithmetic mean. Five variables are used to measure the teaching quality and overall teaching quality is calculated using mean percentage score (MPS)

MPS = (Mean Score / Maximum possible Score) x 100

Action Taken:


Proper suggestions were consolidated to communicate to the Principal and the College council to ensure the proper redressal of the suggestions.
